Subject: Agreements for On-Call Park Professional Services

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a resolution authorizing agreements for on-call park professional services with seven contractors for the terms of February 1, 2016 through January 31, 2019 for an aggregate amount of \$3,000,000.

BACKGROUND:

The Parks Department has used a number of three-year on-call agreements with consultants providing park professional services since 2009, which has expedited numerous County Parks projects. These agreements were due to expire December 11, 2015 so the Department issued a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Parks On-Call Professional Services on August 26, 2015. The proposal was distributed by email to 158 contractors and by two consultant marketing firms in California, advertised in the newspaper and posted on the County Parks website. The Department received 27 proposals, which were reviewed by Department of Public Works and Parks Department staff

DISCUSSION:

Through the review process, 19 firms were selected to provide on-call park professional services on an as needed basis. Your Board approved 12 of the 19 contractors' agreements at the January 26, 2016 meeting. The other seven agreements are now finalized for your consideration, and include: 1) Alta Planning and Design for Landscape Architecture services; 2) BKF Engineers for Civil Engineering services; 3) Construction Testing Services for Geotechnical Engineering services; 4) GHD for Archeology services; 5) MIG/TRA for Landscape Architecture, Biological Monitoring, CEQA/NEPA, and Permitting Compliance services; 6) Rincon for Biological Monitoring, CEQA/NEPA, and Permitting Compliance and Archaeology services; and 7) Sequoia Ecological Consulting, Inc. for Biological Monitoring, CEQA/NEPA, and Permitting Compliance services.

The Department will issue individual work orders comprised of a project scope of work and a not to exceed amount to consultants for specific services. Although the not to exceed amount for the individual work order will vary, the cumulative sum of work orders will not exceed the maximum amount of the agreement. Any increase above the amount or term of the agreement(s) would be submitted to your Board for approval.

The term of the agreements will be for three (3) years from February 1, 2016 through January 31, 2019,

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the resolution and agreements as to form and the consultants have executed the agreements.

Approval of this Resolution will contribute to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by enabling the Department to expedite projects that can improve and maintain the integrity of various County infrastructure and protect the environment for the benefit for the public.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The terms of these agreements are from February 1, 2016 through January 31, 2019. Individual on-call agreements for park professional services will vary between \$300,000 and \$500,000, depending on the project category and number of firms to be retained for work in that category. The total maximum obligation for all seven agreements combined is \$3,000,000. Funds to pay the assigned work will come from the Parks Department's General Fund, Acquisition and Development Fund, Coyote Point Marina Fund, as well as Measure A funds. There is no impact to the General Fund for FY2015-16 and FY2016-17 as individual work orders will be funded through previously approved and appropriated projects. There is an unknown impact to the General Fund for FY2017-18 and FY2018-19. For FY2017-18 and FY2018-19, work orders will only be created if they remain within that approved two-year budget.
