**Subject:** Appointments to the Housing and Community Development Committee

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Recommendation for the appointments to the Housing and Community Development Committee, for terms ending December 31, 2020:

- A) Randall Jones representing the Commission on Disabilities; and
- B) Ron Gerber representing the City of South San Francisco; and
- C) Sandra Council representing the City of San Mateo.

**BACKGROUND:**

The Committee makes recommendations to the Board of Supervisors related to the expenditure of all housing and community development funds, reviews and provides a forum for public comment on affordable housing and community development needs and priorities related to the development of the Consolidated Plan and related Annual Action Plans.

**DISCUSSION:**

Randall Jones is a member of the Executive Committee and works in the disabilities field as a Regional Director for Social Vocational Services in South San Francisco. Randall will make a fine addition to the HCDC with his vast experience and commitment to the disabilities community.

Ron was hired by the City of South San Francisco in August of 2015 to serve as the Economic Development and Housing Manager. From 2011 to 2015 Ron served as the Economic Development Manager for the City of Walnut Creek where he worked on a variety of Downtown development and urban infill projects handling property disposition matters and revitalization of the 40 year old 240 acre Shadelands business park. He brings 25 years of experience in this field and will bring a wealth of knowledge to this committee.

Sandra is the Housing Manager for City of San Mateo. The Housing Manager supervises the administration of the federal HOME and CDBG programs and all other affordable housing funding sources for the City. Affordable Housing programs include oversight of City's inclusionary rentals and for sale units in market rate developments, first time home buyer programs, assistance to homelessness and supportive housing programs and financial support for long term affordable units by means of new construction, acquisition and rehabilitation. The Housing Manager also works on housing policy and implementation of new programs.

These appointments contribute to the 2025 Shared Vision statement of a Collaborative Community. Our diverse population works well together to build strong communities, effective government and a prosperous economy, civic engagement – including voting, public service, charitable giving, volunteerism, and participation in public discussions of important issues – is uniformly high among the diverse population of San Mateo County
