2. Section 2 – Services to be performed by Contractor of the agreement is amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the payments set forth herein and in Exhibits B (revised 1/2014) and B1, Contractor shall perform services for County in accordance with the terms, conditions, and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit A1.

3. Section 3 – Payments of the agreement is amended to read as follows:

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor in accordance with all terms, conditions and specifications set forth herein and in Exhibit A1, County shall make payment to Contractor based on the rates and in the manner specified in Exhibits B (revised 4/2014) and B1. The County reserves the right to withhold payment if the County determines that the quantity or quality of the work performed is unacceptable. In no event shall the County's total fiscal obligation under this Agreement exceed TWO HUNDRED TWENTY EIGHT THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED SEVENTY FIVE DOLLARS (\$228,375).

4. Section 4 – Term and Termination is amended to read as follows:

Subject to compliance with all terms and conditions, the term of this Agreement shall be from July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2018.

- 7. All other terms and conditions of the agreement dated July 9, 2013 and subsequent amendments between the County and Contractor shall remain in full force and effect.

Scope of Work July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2018

In consideration of the payment set forth in Exhibits B (revised 4/2014) and B1, Contractor shall provide the following services. All payments under this Agreement must directly support services specified in this Agreement. Contractor will provide child abuse prevention and intervention services to the San Mateo County Human Services Agency as follows:

I. Services

Contractor shall provide the following annual services:

- a. Implement two (2) "Positive Discipline" Training Sessions for an 8-10 week duration each year (one at a Half Moon Bay site and one at a Moonridge site).
- Implement mental health consultations intended to meet the social and emotional needs of at-risk children and families. This will include instruction and guidance for both the teaching staff and identified family.
- Implement staff and parent trainings around these topics: Mandated
 Reporting, Domestic Violence, Sudden Infant Death Syndrome, and Shaken
 Baby Syndrome.
- d. Family services staff will provide intense case management and service coordination which is monitored and supported through reflective supervision by the Family Services Manager.
- e. Implement parent and education series around positive discipline, provide comprehensive family support services, and provide support and training to family services staff.

In addition to providing the aforementioned services, Contractor will also:

- f. Attend all monthly Children's Collaborative Action Team (CCAT) meetings during the contract period.
- g. Provide an annual presentation pertaining to the services provided under this contract at a CCAT meeting to be determined by the Contractor and the CCAT Chair.

- h. Participate in a Peer Review process to be determined by the CCAT Program Manager.
- i. Administer client satisfaction surveys
- Attend quarterly training sessions during the contract period determined by the Contractor, CCAT Chair, and CCAT Program Manager.

II. Program Outcomes:

- A. Contractor agrees to the following outcomes:
 - Increased capacity within parents to positively guide and direct their children when implementing structure, setting boundaries, and managing difficult behaviors.
 - a. 75% of parents enrolled at the site will receive training in positive discipline and parenting skills at some point within the program year.
 - b. 80% of parents who received training will report that they know how to parent their children positively and are utilizing techniques that they learned from their trainings with their children.
 - Increased awareness and ability of staff to care for and provide needed assistance to at-risk families in an effort to serve as the support needed to prevent circumstances known to provoke instances of abuse and neglect.
 - a. 100% of the parents enrolled in the program will complete a needs/strengths assessment at intake. These parents will receive resources and referrals based on these needs.
 - 95% will establish a partnership goal that aims at increasing their selfsufficiency, and lowering their risk-factors.
 - 3. 80% of participating families identify and attain appropriate and necessary support services.

B. Board Level Performance Measure

Contractor understands and agrees that the services under this agreement will be evaluated by County for long-term impact based on the following performance measure table and will include this data measure in reports as required in section IV of this Exhibit.

III. <u>Program Monitoring</u>

The CCAT Program Manager and Analyst will conduct a site visit at least once a year to review the program and service delivery system. Time of these visits will be arranged in advance. During these visits, activities may include but are not limited to: review of the Contractor's policies and procedures, training materials, data collection methods, participant records, discussion of submitted quarterly review reports, outcome results and trends, logic model, client progress, and providing training and technical assistance. Additionally, the Contractor is required to attend monthly CCAT meetings and provide updated reports on program activities per annual schedule.

IV. Reporting and Invoicing

- a. Contractor shall be responsible for submitting quarterly activity reports and brief mid-year and year end narrative reports utilizing the format provided by the Human Services Agency. Quarterly activity reports and brief narratives will show the program's performance and outcomes.
- Reports and invoices shall be sent electronically to

- c. Payments will be processed upon receipt of Quarterly Reports.
- d. Quarterly Reports and Invoices are due at the same time, based on the following schedule:

Quarterly activity reports and brief narratives will show the program's performance and outcomes.

- e. **The mid-year report** is due on: January 31, 2014, January 31, 2015, January 31, 2016, **January 31, 2017**, and **January 31, 2018**.
- f. The year-end report is due on: July 31, 2014, July 31, 2015, July 31, 2016, July 31, 2017, and July 31, 2018.
- g. The year-end report will include the Office of Child Abuse Prevention Client data [inclusive of the following client demographic information: number of clients that are served (children, children with disabilities, parents/caregivers, parents/caregivers with disabilities, and families) and clients' ethnicity (Caucasian: non-Hispanic, Hispanic, Black, Asian, Filipino, Multiracial, and other ethnicity)], and an annual budget showing planned and actual program costs.

Payments and Rates July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2018

In consideration of the services provided by Contractor described in Exhibit A1 and subject to the terms of the Agreement, County shall pay Contractor based on the following fee schedule and terms:

- County shall pay the Contractor a quarterly fixed rate of \$11,250 upon receipt and approval of invoices. Costs shall not exceed FORTY FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$45,000) annually. Contractor may transfer funds within personnel and operating expenses. Transfer of funds between personnel and operating expenses requires the approval of the CCAT Program Manager.
- Contractor shall submit quarterly invoices for each Fiscal Year as follows:
