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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH INTERPRETERS
UNLIMITED, INC. FOR LANGUAGE INTERPRETATION SERVICES, FOR THE TERM
OF JULY 1, 2016 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2019, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED
\$900,000**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County, or any Department thereof; and

WHEREAS, in October 2006 San Mateo County's Board of Supervisors accepted the "Linguistic Access Study: Summary of Findings and Recommendations Report"; A key recommendation noted in the report included expanding the availability and use of oral language services and translation services to a wider range of settings and languages; and

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2016, Health System Administration released a Request for Proposals for all qualified contractors to provide interpretation and translation services, and of the 11 proposals received, Interpreters Unlimited, Inc. was selected to provide the Health System interpretation services; and

WHEREAS, the parties now wish to execute an agreement effective July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$900,000; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with the agreement and has approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the agreement; and

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signatures thereto; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of the Health System or her designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the county's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
