**Subject:** Agreement with Caminar, Inc. for Housing and Housing-Related Mental Health Services, Case Management, and Rehabilitation Services

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing an agreement with Caminar, Inc. for housing and housing-related mental health services, case management, and rehabilitation services, for the term July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$7,605,608.

**BACKGROUND:**

Since 1964, the nonprofit organization Caminar, Inc. (Caminar) has provided community-based services to individuals with serious mental illness. Caminar's programs focus on maximizing wellness and recovery opportunities for adults with mental, physical, and developmental disabilities. Caminar provides intensive residential care, transitional and permanent supported housing, supported education and supported employment, individual support services, and life skills training.

Under the B-1 Administrative Memorandum, housing and housing-related mental health services are exempt from the County Request for Proposals process.

**DISCUSSION:**

Under this agreement, Caminar will continue to provide crisis residential treatment; transitional residential treatment; supported housing services (including housing rental subsidies and client transportation costs); case management; rehabilitation services (including supported education, supported employment, and enhanced supported education services for Transition Age Youth); Young Adult Independent Living services; and property management of subsidized housing. Additional services to be provided are the administration of the San Mateo Contractors' Association grant funding, and the management of transportation needs of clients in all contractor-sponsored programs.

The Resolution contains the County's standard provisions allowing amendment of the County's fiscal obligations by a maximum of \$25,000 (in aggregate).

The agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form.

Approval of this agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by providing housing and housing-related services, supported education services, and other rehabilitation services. It is anticipated that 70% of clients who receive services will be maintained at a current or lower level of care.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

The term of the agreement is July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017. The amount of the agreement is not to exceed \$7,605,608. Of this amount, it is anticipated that \$2,341,612 will be funded by sales tax through Realignment; \$3,069,516 by Federal Medi-Cal; \$393,090 by the Mental Health Services Act; \$82,512 by Medicare, insurance and fees; and \$39,639 by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration. The Net County Cost is \$1,679,239, which includes the required match for Realignment. Funds for these services are included in the BHRS FY 2016-17 Recommended Budget. The payment provisions in this agreement remain essentially the same as those of the prior agreement.
