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RESOLUTION CHANGING THE NAME OF THE CHILDREN'S COLLABORATIVE ACTION TEAM (CCAT) TO THE SAN MATEO COUNTY CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION COUNCIL (SMCCAPC) AND ACCEPT REVISIONS TO THE BYLAWS

**RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, the Child Abuse Prevention Coordinating Council Act, adopted in 1985 and set forth in Welfare and Institutions Code sections 18980 through 18983.8, evidenced the Legislature's intention that a "Child Abuse Prevention Coordinating Council" be established in each California County; and

WHEREAS, in 1989, the California Legislature passed AB 2994, creating the California State Children's Trust Fund to promote programs to help and support families with children at risk for abuse or neglect, and established that each County's Board of Supervisors may designate an existing local voluntary commission, board, or council to carry out duties primarily related to the prevention of child abuse and neglect, as well as related intervention activities; and

WHEREAS, on October 10, 1999, the Board of Supervisors designated the Children's Collaborative Action Team (CCAT) as the San Mateo County child abuse prevention coordinating council and as the AB2994 Child Abuse Trust Fund Commission for the distribution of child abuse prevention funds; and

**WHEREAS**, on April 1, 2016, recommended changes to the CCAT bylaws were tentatively adopted by the CCAT Oversight Committee; and.

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board of Supervisors for its consideration and acceptance a name change from Children's Collaborative Action Team (CCAT) to San Mateo County Child Abuse Prevention Council (SMCCAPC) and revisions to the bylaws, reference to which is hereby made for further particulars, and has approved the name change as to both form and content.

## NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that:

The President of this Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to accept said name change and revisions to the bylaws for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

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
