- E) Melinda Dubroff, representing Resident member, for a term ending December 31, 2019.

BACKGROUND:

The North Fair Oaks Community Council has traditionally been comprised of a nine-member body that addresses the needs of the community and serves as an advisory council to the Board of Supervisors. These recommendations will fill the vacancies of two members, each representing as a Resident, and one Youth member.

DISCUSSION:

With these appointments, the North Fair Oaks Community Council will be at full capacity. The youth member attends the Council meetings and acts as a voting member.

They are interested and excited to serve on the Council.
