Subject: Acceptance of a \$2.3 million dollar grant from Peninsula Healthcare District

for FY 2012-13

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing an agreement with Peninsula Health Care District accepting a grant in support of the County's Access to Care for Everyone Program for FY 2012-13, in the amount of \$2,300,000.

BACKGROUND:

The County has created and operates the San Mateo County Access and Care for Everyone (ACE) Program for the provision of health coverage for eligible, low-income uninsured County residents, providing healthcare services to this population at the San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC) main campus, SMMC's clinics, the Ravenswood Family Health Center and through other providers who contract with the County. The Peninsula Health Care District (the District) is a public health care district formed and operating pursuant to the Local Health Care District Law. The District serves the community by responding to local health needs, by allocating resources for programs that enhance or serve the health needs of the District's residents. Both the District and the Health System have determined that there is a public need for the provision of basic health care for uninsured District residents residing in San Mateo County. Many of those uninsured residents participate in the ACE Program.

DISCUSSION:

The District decided on July 26, 2012, to provide financial support to the County/SMMC for eligible residents of the District enrolled in the ACE Program. Specifically, the District authorized a grant to the County totaling \$2,300,000 for Fiscal Year 2012-13, to be paid on a quarterly basis, with certain outcomes, including that: at least 979 District residents will be covered by the ACE Program in FY 2012-13; at least 90% of patients

served by SMMC's Innovative Care Clinic will be assigned to the clinic as a "medical home"; the waiting list for new ACE clients seeking non-urgent primary care from the Innovative Care Clinic will be reduced by 20%; the "no show" rate for the Innovative Care Clinic will be 15% or lower; and the inpatient admission rate at SMMC for uncontrolled diabetes will be 10% or lower. These outcomes reflect SMMC's quality and access goals.

SMMC also requests that your Board authorize the Chief of the Health System or designee to execute contract amendments which modify the grant agreement's term and/or language so long as the modified term or language is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

The grant agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form.

This agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by increasing access to health care to those in the County who are uninsured, as well as by achieving important quality metrics for participants of the ACE Program. It is anticipated that 90% of eligible patients at all SMMC ambulatory clinics will be assigned to a primary care provider team.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of this grant agreement is from July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013. The maximum grant amount from the District is \$2,300,000. Funds in this amount are included in the SMMC FY 2012-13 Adopted Budget. If the District encounters any unanticipated changes in funding, the grant award may be reduced.

Expenses at SMMC are covered by fees for services or third-party payors whenever possible. The portion of expenses for services provided to the medically indigent or to those covered by programs that do not fully meet the costs of care are covered by County General Fund contribution to SMMC and are within the existing annual appropriation.
