Subject: Retention of Consulting Firms for On-Call Park Professional Services

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing agreements with consulting firms for On-Call Park Professional Services for the term of December 11, 2012 through December 11, 2015 in an amount not-to-exceed \$300,000 to \$500,000 per agreement.

BACKGROUND:

On April 28, 2009, your Board adopted Resolution No. 070063, which authorized the President of the Board to execute agreements with consulting firms for On-Call Engineering Professional Services for a period of three years.

The consultant selection procedures in the County of San Mateo's Administrative Memorandum B-1 were used to select consultants for the On-Call Park Professional Services Agreements. The Request for Proposals Process Matrix describing the process and selected firms is attached as Exhibit "A."

DISCUSSION:

The 2009 Public Works and Parks Department's On-Call Engineering Professional Services agreements expired on April 27, 2012. Services provided to the Department through the agreements valued over \$1.5 million and enabled the successful completion or partial completion of eighteen (18) projects for the various County maintained special districts and facilities. Based on the successful use of these agreements and the anticipated projects, the Department is interested in executing new On-Call Park Professional Services agreements for a three-year period specifically for the Parks Division. Similar agreements have been developed for the Engineering and Water Resources/Utilities Division.

It is anticipated that a number of park improvement projects will need to be designed, constructed and permitted within the next three years. A majority of these projects are

being proposed to improve new facilities such as Devil's Slide Coastal Trail, Green Valley Trail, San Vicente Creek restoration at Fitzgerald Marine Reserve, Coyote Point Marina improvements, and repair of deteriorated infrastructure, and to meet State and Federal requirements and standards.

Construction costs for the individual projects that will utilize the On-Call Park Professional Services are expected to range between \$50,000 and \$2,000,000. In addition, the projects will be required to obtain the necessary environmental clearances and permits in order to be constructed. The fees for individual "Task Orders" for specific projects will typically range from \$5,000 to \$250,000.

Retaining consultants will enable the Department to utilize consultants with specific expertise for the projects or project components, which may include preliminary studies, alternative design studies, specific designs, environmental assessment, permitting, marina engineering, landscape architectural services, archaeological assessments, and construction management.

Proposals were solicited from engineering and environmental firms with expertise in specific categories, as outlined in Exhibit A, by direct mail (152 potential contractors), notification through marketing firms (2), through advertising in the newspapers, and posting information to the Department's website. Eight categories of services were solicited: Civil Engineering, Geotechnical Engineering, Marina Engineering, Surveying, Landscape Architecture, CEQA/NEPA and Permitting, Archaeology, and Construction Management. The Department reviewed proposals submitted by 56 firms in a total of 78 different categories. Based on the results of the review, the Department is recommending that the firms listed on Exhibit A be retained to provide on-call professional consulting services for the various work categories on an as-needed basis. The consulting service agreements are for maximum amounts ranging from \$300,000 to \$500,000.

Consultants will be selected for specific projects by the Department and Task Orders will be issued to the firms that will detail the requirements of the projects including a scope of work and a not-to-exceed amount. The sum of the fees for the various individual Task Orders, should the firm be assigned to more than one project, will not exceed the not-to-exceed amount of the Agreement. Any increase above the limit of the Agreements that are less than \$500,000 would be brought back to your Board for approval.

The term of the agreement will be for three (3) years from December 11, 2012 through December 11, 2015.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution and agreements as to form.

Approval of this Resolution will contribute to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by enabling the Department to expedite projects that can improve

and maintain the integrity of various County infrastructures and protect the environment for the benefit of the public.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Each On-Call Park Professional Service Agreement has a Not-to-Exceed amount ranging from \$300,000 to \$500,000, depending on the project category and number of firms to be retained for work in that category. Funds to pay for the assigned work will come from the Park Division's General Fund, Acquisition and Development Fund, Marina Fund, or Capital Improvement Program.
