SUBJECT: Certification of Voting Results of the November 6, 2012 Presidential

General Election

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution:

A) Accepting the certificate of the Chief Elections Officer as the statement of the results of the vote as determined by the official canvass of the November 6, 2012 Presidential General Election;

- B) Declaring the persons elected to certain offices; and
- C) Declaring the results of certain measures voted on.

BACKGROUND:

The County's Chief Elections Officer, within 28 days of a presidential primary election, has the authority and duty to inspect, process, and count all ballots cast and prepare a certified statement of the results, and to deliver a duplicate of that statement to the Secretary of State and to the chairperson of the county central committee of each political party. Upon acceptance of this statement, the County Board of Supervisors, as the governing body of the jurisdiction, has the authority and duty to declare elected or nominated the persons having received the highest number of votes for the offices voted on and to declare the voting results for each ballot measure voted on. (Elections Code §§ 15300-15551, 10400-10418.)

DISCUSSION:

On November 6, 2012, the Chief Elections Officer conducted a Presidential General Election to elect a candidate to a non-partisan seat on the County Board of Supervisors and to approve or reject county ballot measures.

Within the 28 days allowed by law, the Chief Elections Officer has completed the official canvass of the votes and has prepared and certified the abstract, or "Statement of the

Vote," resulting from that canvass. Copies of the abstract are submitted herewith and are available upon request from the Chief Elections Officer or you can click the following link to view the entire report:
