AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 2.61.010 AND 2.63.010 OF ARTICLE 2.6 OF TITLE 2 OF THE SAN MATEO COUNTY ORDINANCE CODE, WHICH ESTABLISH THE PLANNING COMMISSION AND THE PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION, RESPECTIVELY

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, ORDAINS as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2.61.010 is hereby amended in its entirety to read as follows:

Section 2.61.010. Planning Commission.

There is in the County a Planning Commission consisting of five members, who shall not be officials or employees of the County of San Mateo. The five members shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors. One member shall reside in each supervisorial district and members shall reside in the district of their appointment during their term. These residency requirements may be waived by the Board of Supervisors if it finds such waiver to be in the public interest. In the event that the Board of Supervisors waives the requirement that one member reside in each supervisorial district, reasonable effort shall be made to seek appointees from areas as geographically near as practicable to the district that lacks a resident member. However, in no event shall more than two (2) members reside in the same supervisorial district.

The term of office for each member shall be four years. The term for a member shall coincide with the term of office of the Supervisor representing the member's district of appointment. When a Supervisor vacates office for any reason, the term of the member appointed from the same district shall also be vacated, except that said member may continue in office until a successor is appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members are limited to three consecutive full terms of office. The twelve year limit does not include partial terms to which members may be appointed at the beginning of their service, or partial terms caused by delay in appointing a replacement at the end of their service.

SECTION 2. Section 2.63.010 is hereby amended in its entirety to read as

follows:

Section 2.63.010. Commissions, members, and terms.

There is established a Parks and Recreation Commission, which shall consist of five members, appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors. One member shall reside in each supervisorial district and members shall reside in the district of their appointment during their term. These residency requirements may be waived by the Board of Supervisors if it finds such waiver to be in the public interest. In the event that the Board of Supervisors waives the requirement that one member reside in each supervisorial district, reasonable effort shall be made to seek appointees from areas as geographically near as practicable to the district that lacks a resident member. However, in no event shall more than two (2) members reside in the same supervisorial district.

The term of office for each member shall be four years. The term for a member shall coincide with the term of office of the Supervisor representing the member's district of appointment. When a Supervisor vacates office for any reason, the term of the member appointed from the same district shall also be vacated, except that said member may continue in office until a successor is appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members are limited to three consecutive full terms of office. The twelve year limit does not include partial terms to which members may be appointed at the beginning of their service, or partial terms caused by delay in appointing a replacement at the end of their service.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from the date of passage thereof.
