**BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA**

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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A SUPERSEDING AGREEMENT WITH AVID  
TRANSLATION FOR LANGUAGE INTERPRETATION AND TRANSLATION  
SERVICES FOR THE TERM OF JUNE 4, 2013 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2016, IN AN  
AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$640,000**

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**RESOLVED**, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to, or for County, or any Department thereof; and

**WHEREAS**, in October 2006 San Mateo County's Board of Supervisors accepted the "Linguistic Access Study: Summary of Findings and Recommendations Report"; A key recommendation noted in the report included expanding the availability and use of oral language services and translation services to a wider range of settings and languages; and

**WHEREAS**, in January 2013 Public Health, Policy and Planning released a Request for Proposals for all qualified contractors to provide interpretation and translation services; and of the six proposals received, Avid Translation was one of two contractors selected to provide the entire Health System interpretation and translation services; and

**WHEREAS**, both parties wish to enter into an Agreement effective June 4, 2013 through June 30, 2016, for a maximum obligation of \$640,000; and

**WHEREAS**, this Board of Supervisors has been presented with the Agreement and has approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the Agreement.

**NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED** that the President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signatures thereto.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that your Board to authorize the Chief of the Health System or designee to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
