Subject: Master Services Agreements Resolution with Eligible Vendors

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing the Chief Information Officer or his designee to execute agreements with each vendor listed in Attachment A to provide information technology services for the term of February 11, 2014 through February 10, 2017, for an aggregate amount to not to exceed \$25,000,000.

BACKGROUND:

Starting in November of 2006, Information Services Department (ISD) working with Procurement has issued RFP #1172, #ISD1800 and #ISD1821 every three years to select three cabling vendors for providing the County with cabling assistance on capital and small project-based wiring infrastructure jobs within the County under a master contract. This program has proven to be very successful resulting in a decrease in staff time for processing contracts, faster response to departmental requests for service and a level of standardization within the physical infrastructure.

Building on the success of that program, ISD released RFP #1825 in November 2013 to pre-qualify a variety of select technology vendors for a broad spectrum of IT project-based needs. Quality of work, subject matter expertise, available labor support, proven large and small project experience, and experience with providing services to government agencies were some of the criteria used in the evaluation process.

DISCUSSION:

With your Board's approval, ISD would like to select from pre-approved vendors for a variety of IT project needs. Using this proven method, ISD would have the option of contracting from the qualified vendors for a specific technology or group of technologies. This would allow ISD to choose a vendor from Attachment A without having to use the Request for Proposal process or submitting a sole source justification for each agreement and would authorize the Chief Information Officer or his designee to sign

agreements over \$100,000 and in aggregate up to an amount not to exceed \$25,000,000, thereby saving the County time and money by operating more efficiently. The vendors for any given technology or group of technologies would bid per occurrence on any project opportunity. The recommended vendors from Attachment A are compliant with the County's Equal Benefits and Jury Compliance ordinances and will submit their quotes for future projects. ISD will execute all agreements using the County's standard templates and will seek County Counsel review on all agreements over \$100,000.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution as to form.

Approval of this Resolution contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Collaborative Community by permitting the use of IT services in an expeditious manner and will help customers meet their goals on-time and on budget.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The total obligation for this action is not to exceed \$25,000,000. Total expenditures across all agreements will be monitored and managed by ISD fiscal staff. Funding for IT services will come from departmental appropriations for projects and costs will be charged to the appropriate department through the ISD work authorization process. Countywide projects will be funded through the Measure A, ITSP and/or Non-departmental project funding sources. There is no obligation on the part of the County to purchase any amount of services as a result of this action.
