Subject: Agreement with Ravenswood Family Health Center

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing an agreement with Ravenswood Family Health Center to provide outreach, enrollment and retention services for children and adult health coverage programs for the term of January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2015, in an amount not to exceed \$105,304.

BACKGROUND:

Since 2003, the Health System has contracted with community-based organizations to conduct outreach and enrollment assistance for low-income uninsured residents to obtain health insurance coverage. In the spring of 2013, the Health System issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to enlist community-based entities interested in providing such services in alignment with changes ushered in through the implementation of the federal Affordable Care Act (ACA). Five entities were recommended and the recommendations were endorsed by the Children's Health Initiative (CHI) Oversight Committee, an advisory body that guides the work of the Health System and is part of the Health Plan of San Mateo's governance structure.

Ravenswood Family Health Center (RFHC) is one of the five entities recommended through the RFP selection process. As a federally qualified health center founded in 2001, RFHC provides access to health care services to approximately 10,800 uninsured, low-income and medically underserved residents living in the southern region of San Mateo County. The Health System has partnered with RFHC through the CHI/Health Coverage Unit (HCU) to enroll uninsured children and adults into the various health coverage programs for the past ten years.

DISCUSSION:

The RFP articulated the key competencies expected of contractors, including: a) demonstrated trust among targeted hard-to-reach communities; b) the capacity to offer “no wrong door” and “one stop shop” approaches through which residents can receive help in connecting to health coverage for all members of their household; and c) an ability to adapt to the changing health coverage landscape.

Under this agreement, RFHC will perform outreach, enrollment and retention activities targeting uninsured residents in the southern region of San Mateo County that are eligible for health care coverage programs. These programs include Medi-Cal, Healthy Kids, Access and Care for Everyone (ACE) and Covered California. The contractor will oversee staff who will be trained as Certified Enrollment Counselors and will use the One-e-App and Covered California web-based application processing systems to enroll eligible children and adults into health coverage programs.

The Health Coverage Unit is also asking the Board to authorize the Chief of the Health System or his/her designee to execute contract amendments which modify the County’s maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) for each agreement and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

This contract is late due to protracted contract negotiations and the contractor’s competing priorities related to preparing for the ACA.

This agreement and Resolution have been reviewed and approved by County Counsel as to form. The contractor meets insurance certificate requirements.

The contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as all other contract provisions that are required by County ordinance and administrative memoranda, including but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination, and equal benefits.

Approval of the agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Healthy Community by ensuring that uninsured residents living in the southern region of San Mateo County will be screened, enrolled, and retained in various health coverage programs. Maximizing enrollment in available health coverage programs strengthens the county’s ability to provide residents’ access to healthcare. It is anticipated that contractor will enroll 1525 children and adults.

*This enrollment target is lower due to a reduced grant amount (as requested by the Contractor) from \$124,000 annually in FY12-13 to \$52,652 annually in FY13-14.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of this agreement is January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2015. The amount of the agreement is not to exceed \$105,304. Agreement costs of \$26,326 are included in the HCU FY2013-14 Adopted Budget and \$52,652 in the HCU FY2014-15 Recommended Budget, and \$26,326 will be included in the HCU FY2015-16 Recommended Budget.

The cost of the agreement is covered by contributions from the First 5 San Mateo County, Peninsula and Sequoia Healthcare Districts, the CHI Trust Fund, federal reimbursements from the Medi-Cal Administrative Activities program and the County General Fund. The Net County Cost for this agreement for FY 2013-14 is \$11,425.
