Subject: Agreement with The Gordian Group for the Job Order General Construction System

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a Resolution authorizing:

- A) The President of the Board of Supervisors to execute an agreement with The Gordian Group for the maintenance and support of Progen, the Job Order Contracting System, for the term of August 12, 2014 through August 11, 2017, in an amount not to exceed \$500,000; and
- B) The Director of Public Works and/or his designee, to execute individual and/or separate Job Orders and incur fees under this agreement which fees, in aggregate, shall not exceed \$500,000.

BACKGROUND:

Job Order Contracting (JOC) is a task-based method of project delivery whereby a general contractor agrees to perform myriad construction tasks for a set fee. JOC has been utilized extensively at the Federal, State and Local government levels throughout the Country for over 20 years.

On July 26, 2011, your Board approved Resolution No. 071562 which authorized the execution of an agreement with The Gordian Group to develop, implement and support a JOC System, Progen, for the Department of Public Works.

The Department of Public Works has made increasing and substantial use of this System, since its implementation. Over \$20 million in projects have been completed under the program in the past five years.

DISCUSSION:

The Department is currently using The Gordian Group's proprietary software system, Progren, for seven regular JOC's. The System has been customized to fit the County's JOC needs. The contracts will be completed in February 2015.

The Department is requesting a waiver of the Request for Proposals process because The Gordian Group remains the sole source provider of products and services for Progen. A listing of agencies which have recently conducted RFP's and awarded The Gordian Group sole source contracts, is attached for reference.

The Contractor has assured compliance with the County's Contractor Employee Jury Service Ordinance, as well as all other provisions that are required by County ordinance and administrative memoranda, including but not limited to insurance, hold harmless, non-discrimination and equal benefits.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution and Agreement as to form.

Approval of this action contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of Collaborative Community by reducing the cost and time required to execute major maintenance and renovation projects throughout all County facilities.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The term of this Agreement is August 12, 2014 through August 11, 2017. The not to exceed amount is \$500,000.

The cost of maintenance and support for this System will remain a fixed, constant fee of 1.95% over the cost of each individual Job Order, not to exceed \$500,000 in aggregate.

The fees payable under the terms of this Agreement are funded through allocations made by work authorizations established for each job order. The various individual job orders are funded through grants, bonds, departmental sources, and the General Fund. Fees payable to The Gordian Group are included in each project's budget. There is no specific budget associated with the Job Order Contracting System.

Sole Source Justification for The Gordian Group

The Gordian Group (Gordian) is the only firm in the nation that provides the full range of products and services necessary to develop, implement and support Job Order Contracting (JOC) programs for the County of San Mateo.

The Gordian JOC Solution is a highly specialized and proprietary solution consisting of the following components:

- eGordian web-based JOC applications configured to meet the needs of the County,
- Construction Task Catalog customized to include the construction tasks required by the County, with task prices based on the County's local cost of labor, materials and equipment,
- Extensive implementation services and support materials to train the County and construction contractor staff to properly utilize the system, and
- On-going technical maintenance and support services during the term of the contract, including 24/7 tollfree software support.

Gordian does not rely on third party vendors and other service providers.

Gordian's JOC Applications – A primary feature of the Gordian JOC Solution is the proprietary, web-based eGordian JOC information management system. eGordian JOC applications have the functionality to completely manage the JOC process, from the contractor's preparation of a Price Proposal, to the County's review of the Price Proposal, to issuing the Job Order, to tracking M/WBE participation.

Construction Task Catalog – More important than the software is the Construction Task Catalog that Gordian provides to the County. The Construction Task Catalog is the only unit price book available that is developed and maintained specifically for JOC users.

Gordian Selected as the Sole Responsive Responsible Respondent

Gordian has been awarded numerous contracts on a sole source basis or as the only responsive and responsible respondent in a competitive procurement. A list of contracts awarded to Gordian during the past few years on a sole source basis or as the sole responsive responsible respondent is presented on the next page.

Based on our research, we believe awarding a sole source contract to The Gordian Group is justified because no other firm exists that has the qualifications and experience to provide the products and services necessary to implement and support a successful JOC program for the County of San Mateo. Further, since The Gordian Group is the current provider of the County of San Mateo's JOC program, a sole source contract would enable the County to continue its JOC program and utilize its existing JOC contracts without interruption.
