Subject: No Parking During Specified Hours Zone on Tunitas Creek Road, in

Unincorporated San Mateo County

RECOMMENDATION:

Adopt a resolution authorizing the establishment of a No Parking during Specified Hours zone on Tunitas Creek Road, in Unincorporated San Mateo County.

BACKGROUND:

Your Board has adopted similar resolutions and ordinances designating various traffic controls.

- 1. Section 22507 et. al. of the California Vehicle Code provides that local authorities may prohibit or restrict the stopping, parking or standing of vehicles by resolution or ordinance.
- 2. The Department of Public Works received several requests from concerned citizens for overnight parking restrictions along Tunitas Creek Road to address large crowds that periodically park overnight near Tunitas Creek Beach and associated issues such as trash accumulation alongside the road.

DISCUSSION:

The Department, in conjunction with the Sheriff's Office, evaluated the requests and determined that the recommended parking restrictions in conjunction with the installation of centerline and edge line stripes which will be installed separately, will benefit the community. We recommend adoption of an overnight parking restriction at the identified location.

Property owners within 300 feet of the proposed parking zone locations were notified of the date and time of your Board's meeting when these items will be considered. The objections and support received to date are summarized in Attachment A.

The location of parking zones and other traffic restrictions on County-maintained streets are currently shown on maps in the Department of Public Works, and will be made available in list form on the Department's website. The master lists will be updated to reflect the recommended changes if your Board approves the proposed resolution.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the resolution as to form.

Approval of this resolution contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Livable Community by allowing residents, business owners, and schools to help shape the neighborhood traffic controls in a way that best fits their collective needs.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost for staff time involved in evaluating and processing requests for traffic regulations is part of the administrative cost associated with evaluating traffic-related requests involving the County-maintained road system, and is financed with Road Funds. The cost of installing overnight parking restriction sign is estimated to be \$5,000. There will be no impact to the General Fund.

Staff received requests from concerned citizens for a No Parking during Specified Hours Zone:


Key Facts:

- The proposed No Parking Zone will limit parking on narrow portions of the road where access, including that of emergency vehicles, becomes impeded when cars are parked on both side of the road.
- Beach parties attract visitors who park along the road block access and leave debris for residents to clean up.
- 0 objections received, 0 support received

Staff Recommendation:

Establish a no parking zone during specified hours 10:00 PM to 5:00AM.
