AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 2.02.020, 2.02.030, 2.02.040, 2.02.050 AND 2.02.060 OF CHAPTER 2.02, OF TITLE 2 OF THE SAN MATEO COUNTY ORDINANCE CODE ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California,

ORDAINS as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 2.02.020 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.02.020. First Supervisorial District:

The First Supervisorial District of the County of San Mateo, State of California, is hereby established and declared to be and contain all that territory of San Mateo County described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the County border, the Brisbane border, and the South San Francisco border; thence proceeding westerly along the border of South San Francisco to Interstate 101; thence proceeding southerly along I-101 to Sister Cities Boulevard; thence proceeding westerly along Sister Cities Boulevard and Hillside Boulevard to the border of South San Francisco; thence proceeding westerly and southwesterly along the City border to McLellan Drive; thence proceeding southerly along McLellan to El Camino Real; thence proceeding westerly along El Camino Real to Hickey Boulevard; thence proceeding westerly along Hickey to Junipero Serra Blvd; thence proceeding southerly along Junipero Serra to Avalon Dr; thence proceeding westerly along Avalon Dr to I-280; thence proceeding southerly along I-280 to Sneath Ln; thence proceeding westerly along Sneath Ln to Skyline Blvd; thence proceeding southerly along Skyline to the southern border of San Bruno; thence proceeding easterly along the border of San Bruno to I-280; thence proceeding southerly along I-280 to the border of Millbrae; thence proceeding southerly along the border of Millbrae to I-280; thence proceeding southerly along I-280 to the extension of Summit Dr just east of Crystal Springs Golf Course; thence proceeding easterly to the border of Hillsborough; thence proceeding clockwise along the border of

Hillsborough to San Mateo; thence proceeding easterly along the border of San Mateo to the railroad; thence southeasterly along the railroad to E 4th Ave; thence easterly along E 4th Ave to E 3rd Ave; thence easterly along E 3rd Ave to J Hart Clinton Dr; thence southeasterly along J Hart Clinton Dr to E 3rd Ave; thence easterly along E 3rd Ave to the border of San Mateo and Foster City; thence clockwise along the border of San Mateo and Foster City to the County border; thence counter-clockwise along the County border to the point of beginning; and depicted in a map that can be viewed in the County Offices.

SECTION 2. Section 2.02.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.02.030. Second Supervisorial District:

The Second Supervisorial District of the County of San Mateo, State of California, is hereby established and declared to be and contain all that territory of San Mateo County described as follows:

Beginning at the border of the County, Redwood City and Foster City; thence proceeding southwesterly along the border of Foster City to Belmont: thence proceeding along the northern border of Belmont to the railroad; thence proceeding southeasterly along the railroad to Ralston Ave; thence proceeding westerly along Ralston Ave to Chula Vista Drive; thence proceeding southerly along Chula Vista to Belmont Creek; thence proceeding easterly 125 feet to the eastern border of Census Block 060816090002005; thence proceeding southeasterly along the eastern border of Census Block 060816090002005 to the southern border of Belmont; thence proceeding westerly and northwesterly along the border of Belmont to Ralston Avenue; thence proceeding westerly along Ralston to State Highway 92; thence proceeding westerly along Highway 92 to Interstate 280; thence proceeding northerly along I-280 to the border of the Burlingame Elementary School District; thence proceeding westerly along the School District border to the City border of Hillsborough; thence proceeding easterly along the northern border of Hillsborough to San Mateo; thence proceeding easterly along the border of San Mateo to the railroad; thence southeasterly along the railroad to E 4th Ave; thence easterly along E 4th Ave to E 3rd Ave; thence easterly along E 3rd Ave to J Hart Clinton Dr; thence southeasterly along J Hart Clinton Dr to E 3rd Ave; thence easterly along E 3rd Ave to the border of San Mateo and Foster City; thence clockwise along the border of San Mateo and Foster City to the point of beginning; and depicted in a map that can be viewed in the County Offices.

SECTION 3. Section 2.02.040 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.02.040 Third Supervisorial District:

The Third Supervisorial District of the County of San Mateo, State of

California, is hereby established and declared to be and contain all that territory of San Mateo County described as follows:

Beginning at the border of East Palo Alto, Menlo Park, and the County's southern border; thence proceeding northwesterly along the Menlo Park city border to Highway 101; thence proceeding northwesterly along Highway 1010 to the southwestern extension of Carlton Ave; thence following the southwestern extension of Carlton Ave to Bay Rd; thence proceeding westerly along Bay Rd to the border of Atherton; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the border of Atherton to Alameda; thence proceeding northwesterly along Alameda to Harcross Rd and the border of Redwood City; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the border of Redwood City to Acorn Place; thence proceeding northerly along Acorn Place to Belle Roche Avenue; thence proceeding northerly along Belle Roche to Clifford Avenue; thence proceeding westerly along Clifford to Palomar Rd; thence proceeding northerly along Palomar and Bromley Dr to the city border of San Carlos; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the border of San Carlos to Old Country Rd; thence proceeding northwesterly along Old Country Rd to the border of Belmont; thence proceeding westerly along the border of Belmont to Ralston Avenue; thence proceeding westerly along Ralston to State Highway 92; thence proceeding westerly along Highway 92 to Interstate 280; thence proceeding northerly along I-280 to the border of Millbrae; thence proceeding northerly along the border of Millbrae to I-280; thence proceeding northerly along I-280 to the border of San Bruno; thence proceeding northerly and westerly along the border of San Bruno to Pacifica; thence proceeding northerly along the border of Pacifica to the Pacific Ocean and the County border: thence proceeding counterclockwise along the County border to the point of beginning; and depicted in a map that can be viewed in the County Offices.

SECTION 4. Section 2.02.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.02.050. Fourth Supervisorial District:

The Fourth Supervisorial District of the County of San Mateo, State of California, is hereby established and declared to be and contain all that territory of San Mateo County described as follows:

Beginning at the border of East Palo Alto, Menlo Park, and the County's southern border; thence proceeding northwesterly along the Menlo Park city border to Highway 101; thence proceeding northwesterly along Highway 1010 to the southwestern extension of Carlton Ave; thence following the southwestern extension of Carlton Ave to Bay Rd; thence proceeding westerly along Bay Rd to the border of Atherton; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the border of Atherton to Alameda; thence proceeding northwesterly along Alameda to Harcross Rd and the

border of Redwood City; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the border of Redwood City to Acorn Place; thence proceeding northerly along Acorn Place to Belle Roche Avenue; thence proceeding northerly along Clifford to Palomar Rd; thence proceeding northerly along Palomar and Bromley Dr to the city border of San Carlos; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the border of San Carlos to Old Country Rd; thence proceeding northwesterly along Old Country Rd to the border of Belmont; thence proceeding westerly along the border of Belmont to the railroad; thence proceeding northerly along the railroad to the border of San Mateo; thence proceeding easterly along the border of San Mateo and continuing easterly along the southern border of Foster City to the County border in the Bay; thence proceeding counter-clockwise along the County border to the point of beginning; and depicted in a map that can be viewed in the County Offices.

SECTION 5. Section 2.176.060 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 2.176.060. Fifth Supervisorial District:

The Fifth Supervisorial District of the County of San Mateo, State of California, is hereby established and declared to be and contain all that territory of San Mateo County described as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the County's western border, the Pacific Ocean, and the northern border of Pacifica; thence proceeding easterly and southerly along the border of Pacifica past Sneath Rd to the border of San Bruno; thence proceeding easterly along the San Bruno border and its easterly extension to Skyline Blvd; thence proceeding northerly along Skyline Blvd to Sneath Ln; thence proceeding easterly along Sneath Ln to Interstate 280; thence proceeding northerly along I-280 to Avalon Dr; thence proceeding easterly along Avalon Dr to Junipero Serra Blvd; thence proceeding northerly along Junipero Serra to Hickey Boulevard; thence proceeding easterly along Hickey to El Camino Real; thence proceeding easterly along El Camino Real to McLellan Drive; thence proceeding northerly along McLellan to the border of South San Francisco; thence proceeding northerly and easterly along the City border to Hillside Boulevard; thence proceeding easterly along Hillside and Sister Cities Boulevard to Interstate 101; thence proceeding northerly along I-101 to the City border; thence proceeding easterly along the border of South San Francisco to the County border; thence proceeding counterclockwise along the County border to the point of beginning; and depicted in a map that can be viewed in the County Offices.

SECTION 6. This ordinance shall be effective thirty (30) days from the date of

passage thereof.
