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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH STERICYCLE, INC. FOR MEDICAL WASTE DISPOSAL FOR THE TERM OF MARCH 1, 2014 THROUGH FEBRUARY 28, 2017, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$360,000

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC) has been contracting with

Stericycle Inc. (Stericycle) since March of 2009, to provide transportation, treatment and

disposal of medical waste; and

WHEREAS in October of 2011, the agreement was amended to expand this service to other locations throughout the Health System; and

WHEREAS, in October of 2013, SMMC completed a comprehensive Request for Proposals for treatment and disposal of medical waste; and

WHEREAS, Stericycle was chosen for elevation based on their innovative approach to handling SMMC's environmental waste by utilizing their Sharps Management Program which uses reusable containers; and

WHEREAS, Stericycle is projecting a 30% reduction in the medical waste disposal expense through participation in this program; and

WHEREAS, SMMC is opting to enroll in Stericycle's Pharmaceutical Waste Compliance Program for the characterization, collection and disposal of Rx waste which ensures compliance with the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA; and

WHEREAS, both parties wish to enter into an agreement whereby Stericycle will provide medical waste disposal for the term of March 1, 2014 through February 28, 2017, for an amount not to exceed \$360,000.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the

President of this Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of the Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief of the Health System or designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
