**Subject:** FY 2015 California Department of Fish and Wildlife Oil Spill Contingency Plan Grant

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Adopt a resolution authorizing the Sheriff or Sheriff's designee to execute an agreement with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife for the distribution of funding in the amount of \$10,000 as part of the FY 2015 Oil Spill Contingency Plan Grant Program.

**BACKGROUND:**

On an annual basis, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife awards local governments (coastal cities and counties) funding to review and revise their Area Contingency Plan, compare the Coast Guard Area Plan (ACP) elements with local government Oil Spill Contingency Plan elements, document the differences to identify equipment and resource gaps, attend area committee meetings, and participate in exercises and drills.

**DISCUSSION:**

After the Cosco Buson oil spill, it is necessary that the County of San Mateo be prepared for any type of spill that could occur on the coast or the bayside of the County.

This grant allows the Office of Emergency Services (OES) to update and expand the County's Oil Spill Contingency Plan in conjunction with the Coast Guard's Oil Spill Plan, participate in the statewide oil spill drill and become familiar with managing an oil spill event should it occur in San Mateo County.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the Resolution and agreement as to form.

Approval of this agreement contributes to the Shared Vision 2025 outcome of a Collaborative Community by bringing together key players to review response plans and

participate in statewide oil spill exercises in order to better respond to an incident involving the Coast or Bayside.
