**County Sanitation District** 

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

Amend and continue the Emergency Proclamation relating to damage in the Crystal Springs County Sanitation District as a result of the January 2017 storms, which still exists and continues to be an emergency, for an additional period in accordance with Government Code section 8630 and Chapter 2.46 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code.

## **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION:**

On February 7, 2017, the Board, in accordance with Government Code section 8630 and Chapter 2.46 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code, ratified action by the Director of Emergency Services proclaiming a local state of emergency. The action was taken after several weeks of severe storms caused a mudslide, damaging a sewage pipe in the Crystal Springs County Sanitation District, located behind the property at 1560 Seneca Lane in unincorporated San Mateo.

The County is waiting for state and federal damage assessment teams to tour the affected area. The renewal of the emergency proclamation by the Board is necessary to maintain eligibility for state and federal financial assistance, and will be continued as long as the emergency remains in effect.

Amendments have been made to the proclamation to meet state and federal requirements.

## **FISCAL IMPACT:**

Preliminary cost estimates for repairs could be up to \$3 million. Renewal of the proclamation of the local severe weather emergency will continue to facilitate reimbursement of expenses under the California Disaster Assistance Act, as well as additional state or federal reimbursement, for resources expended in response to this event.
