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**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH RAIMI AND ASSOCIATES TO
CONDUCT COMMUNITY PLANNING IN FOUR PRIORITIZED NEIGHBORHOODS
WITHIN SAN MATEO COUNTY FOR THE TERM OF MARCH 1, 2018 THROUGH
JUNE 30, 2019, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$358,900**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, Raimi and Associates will facilitate the Community Collaboration for Children's Success project to conduct a place-based, trauma-informed community engagement process in four locations in San Mateo County to identify interconnected strategies which improve the health, well-being and success of vulnerable children and families in San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, Raimi and Associates was selected by a Request for Proposal process to implement trauma-informed community planning in four prioritized neighborhoods within San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board of Supervisors for its consideration and acceptance an agreement, reference to which is hereby made for further particulars, whereby Raimi and Associates will implement community planning in four prioritized neighborhoods within San Mateo County; and

WHEREAS, the parties now wish to execute an agreement effective March 1,

2018 through June 30, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$358,900; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of such agreement, has examined and approved it as both form and content, and desires to enter into it.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED, that the President of the Board of Supervisor be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signature thereto; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Chief of the Health System or her designee is authorized to execute contracts amendments which modify the county's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
