BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA

RESOLUTION SPECIFYING TERMS OF MEMBERS OF THE DELINQUENCY PREVENTION COMMISSION, AND STANDING RULES FOR ITS GOVERNANCE

**RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, sections 225 through 236 of the Welfare and Institutions Code require that each county have a Juvenile Justice Commission consisting of not less than seven and no more than fifteen citizens, whose members are appointed by the Superior Court, and which shall inquire into the administration of the juvenile court law in the county or region in which the commission serves; and

WHEREAS, section 233 of the Welfare and Institutions Code provides that the Board of Supervisors may by ordinance provide for the establishment, support, and maintenance of a Delinquency Prevention Commission, composed of not fewer than seven citizens, to coordinate on a countywide basis the work of those governmental and nongovernmental organizations engaged in activities designed to prevent juvenile delinquency, and that the board may designate the juvenile justice commission to serve in such capacity; and

WHEREAS, section 2.47.030 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code provides that the County Delinquency Prevention Commission shall undertake to cooperate with and assist in coordinating on a County-wide basis the work of those community agencies engaged in activities designed to prevent juvenile and adult

delinquency; and that those persons who now serve or who may hereafter be appointed to serve as members of the Juvenile Justice Commission of San Mateo County shall be and are hereby designated to be the members of the County Delinquency Prevention Commission; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to further clarify the membership of the Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Commission, with the understanding that this clarification is subject to and contingent on the approval of the Superior Court, which has responsibility for the Juvenile Justice Commission.

## NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that:

- The members of the Delinquency Prevention Commission shall be appointed as set forth in state law and county ordinance.
- 2. Members of the Delinquency Prevention Commission shall serve terms of four years, which shall begin on January 1 in which the member was appointed and first attended a meeting as a member of the Commission, and which shall end on December 31 four years thereafter. Upon the conclusion of a term, an appointed member may be reappointed subject to a maximum of twelve years of full terms. The twelve year limit does not include partial terms to which members may be appointed at the beginning of their service, or holdover service caused by delay in appointing a replacement at the end of a member's service. To the extent that the starting dates for each current appointment have lacked consistency, this Board shall set the starting date of each member's term at January 1 for the year that the Commission Member was appointed and first attended a meeting as a member of the Commission. The corresponding end

date for each Commission Member's term will be December 31, four years thereafter.

3. Except as stated herein or as directed by the Superior Court, the Delinquency Prevention Commission will comply with all standing rules for county boards, commissions and advisory committees that are established by the Board of Supervisors.
