RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT WITH PREVENT LIFE SAFETY, EXTENDING THE TERM THROUGH JANUARY 1, 2021 AND INCREASING THE MAXIMUM FISCAL OBLIGATION BY \$141,000, TO A NEW NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT OF \$239,000

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works (Department) is required to annually inspect fire doors at the San Mateo Medical Center (SMMC); and

WHEREAS, the County has contracted with Prevent Life Safety to provide inspection, repair and recertification of 731 fire doors at (SMMC); and

WHEREAS, on a recent inspection, a significant number of doors failed the inspection and require repair; and

WHEREAS, the Department is requesting to amend the current agreement amount by \$141,000 with Prevent Life Safety to a new, not-to-exceed amount of \$239,000, and extending the term for an additional one-year, ending on January 1, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the term extension and the additional funding will allow the repair and re-certification of all fire doors that failed the inspection and maintain all doors in a serviceable condition for term of the agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Board has considered and concurs with the recommendation of the Director of Public Works.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED as follows:

1. The Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes an amendment to the agreement with Prevent Life Safety, extending the term through January 1, 2021 and increasing the maximum fiscal obligation by \$141,000, to a new not to exceed amount of \$239,000.
2. The Director of Public Works, or his designee, is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.
