

- Memorial Park
 - Potable water treatment plant
 - Wastewater system designed

MEASURE K

- 36 Projects/Initiatives: 70% on schedule
- \$8.6 million spent since FY 2013-14
 - Routine non-capital maintenance projects
 - Multiple ongoing capital projects



FY 2018-19 CHALLENGES

- Recruitment and retention of entry level rangers
- Proactive fire fuel reduction and vegetation management
- Increasing visitors = decreasing maintenance time

- Visitor diversity
- Facility & resource management
- Capital projects
- Pilot tiny homes for rangers
