## THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING OCTOBER 2018 AS

## FILIPINO AMERICAN HISTORY MONTH

**WHEREAS**, since 1988, communities across California and the United States have set aside the month of October to recognize the achievements and contributions of Filipinos and Filipino

**WHEREAS**, California is home to nearly half of the Filipino population in the United States, with more than 1,470,000 Filipinos calling the Golden State home according to the 2010 Census, and is the location of many vibrant Filipino communities, including those in Daly City, Los Angeles, San Francisco, Stockton, Vallejo, Delano, San Diego, and Salinas among others; and

**WHEREAS**, since their first documented arrival in Morro Bay, California on October 18, 1857, Filipino Americans have made remarkable contributions to every sector of American life. Filipinos have built and defended our country in every American Conflict since the early 1900s, and helped bring about progress in the farms of Delano, California. They have made cultural, economic, social, and other contributions that have become a vital part of the rich, diverse, and vibrant tapestry of our nation; and

**WHEREAS**, Filipino Americans have served the public in a wide range of capacities, including, but not limited to, Chief Justice of the California Supreme Court, representatives to the United States Congress, legislators in the state legislatures of California and other states, and other city, state, and federal leaders of the United States; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED** that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, hereby designates October, 2018 as Filipino American History Month and encourages everyone to recognize, honor and celebrate the tremendous role played by Filipinos in the continental United States for 431 years and counting.
