

- Expand behavioral health pods and implement 10-bed Acute Stabilization Unit in jails
- Achieve performance milestones to earn maximum funding:
 - San Mateo Medical Center Medi-Cal waiver programs and Fee-for-Service revenues
 - Behavioral Health & Recovery Services Drug Medi-Cal revenues

BUILD HEALTHY COMMUNITIES THROUGH POLICY CHANGE

Oral Health Coalition

- Advanced oral health for 700 preschool and elementary students through educational presentations
- Worked with two school districts to analyze and assist 272 kindergartners in addressing their dental needs

Behavioral Health & Recovery Services

• Supported the Youth Commission initiative to ban flavored tobacco





BUILD HEALTHY COMMUNITIES THROUGH POLICY CHANGE

Measure K Housing Inspection Program

 Augmented housing inspections and community outreach for properties with the most complaints, reducing violations from 557 to 309 and improving living conditions

Environmental Health Services

• Finalized Measure K groundwater study with over 300 stakeholders to inform local water monitoring needs





BUILD HEALTHY COMMUNITIES THROUGH POLICY CHANGE

Measure K Community Collaboration for Children's Success Initiative

 Launched community planning in North Fair Oaks and South SF to better understand what our highest risk children need

SMC Healthcare Coalition

• Enhanced disaster preparedness by expanding from 9 to over 50 members, applying lessons learned from Napa/Sonoma fires





PROVIDE THE RIGHT SERVICE AT THE RIGHT TIME AND PLACE

Integrated Medication Assisted Treatment

- Reduced Emergency Department and Psychiatric Emergency visits from 484 to 262 (46%)
- Overall reduction in health care costs from \$2.38M to \$1.24M (48%)

PROVIDE THE RIGHT SERVICE AT THE RIGHT TIME AND PLACE

San Mateo Medical Center

 Improved access to specialty services by reducing wait time from an average of 4 days down to 20 minutes

Whole Person Care

 Enhanced service coordination and increased capacity to support 2,947 clients with the most complex conditions, with Measure K support for housing 27 clients





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Whole Person Care

PROVIDE A GREAT EXPERIENCE TO ALL WHO INTERACT WITH US

Health Coverage Unit

 Created the State's first autoenrollment process for eligible residents, streamlining local health coverage enrollment for 20K ACE clients

Pride Center

 Launched mental health services to serve LGBTQ+ population





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PROVIDE A GREAT EXPERIENCE TO ALL WHO INTERACT WITH US

Correctional Health Services

- Created specialty behavioral health "pod" for 22 inmates soon to be 36
- Reduced number of inmates requiring suicide watch from 79 to 5

Working with the Project Development Unit, Department of Housing, and Department of Public Works, SMC Health made progress on capital projects:

- Animal Shelter
- Cordilleras
- Daly City Youth Health Center

- Serenity House
- San Mateo Campus
- Waverly Place



BE A GREAT PLACE TO WORK

- Launched Health Information Exchange, enabling providers to access secure medical records for over 300K patients across SMC Health
- Over 800 staff identified and submitted 2,300 areas for improvement to solve to root





BE A GREAT PLACE TO WORK

- Award-winning and fully accredited Continuing Medical Education program provided 70 activities/2,000+ training hours for heath care providers in the last year
- Launched staff survey to assess racial equity understanding and inform future trainings and system improvements



USE OUR FUNDS WISELY

- \$306K saved in Medi-Cal Inmate Program reimbursement for 25 inmates and 136 inpatient days
- Behavioral Health & Recovery Services shortened revenue cycle by 68%, reducing accruals and increasing financial planning certainty
- \$1.5M (86%) increase in Medi-Cal revenue for substance use disorder treatment services

USE OUR FUNDS WISELY Partnering with the Health Plan of San Mateo

- SMMC authorization process improvements increased timeliness of revenue capture for inpatient surgeries, increasing surgery revenues received by \$600K annually
- Family Health Services streamlined care coordination for children with complex medical needs, keeping monthly inpatient member costs relatively flat
