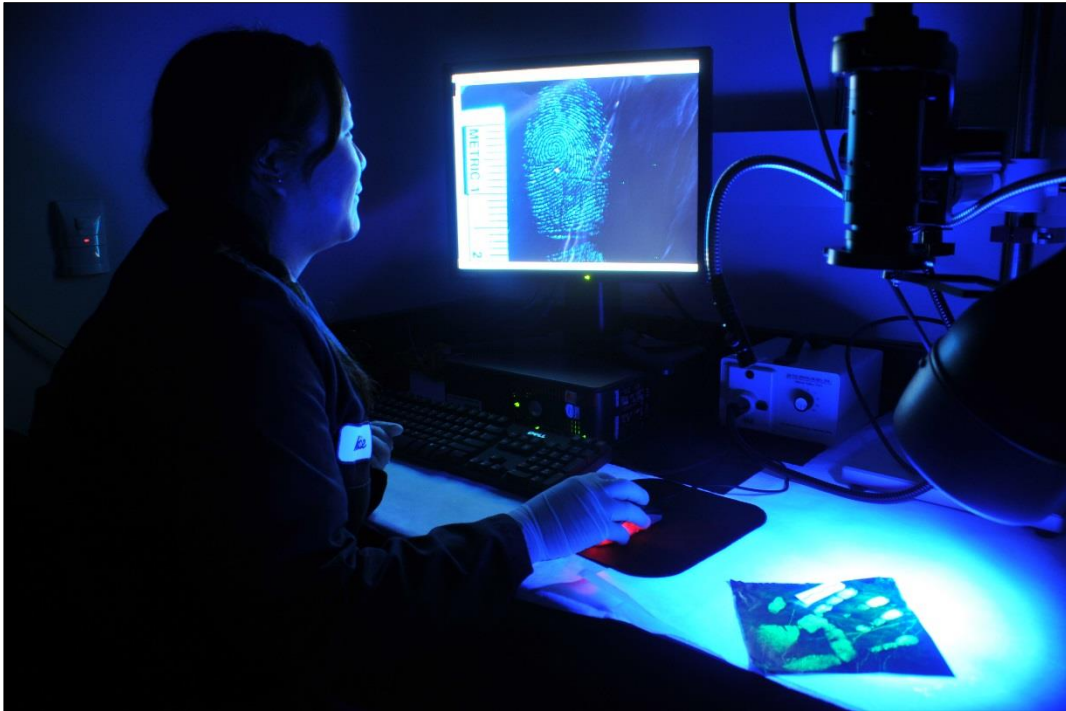

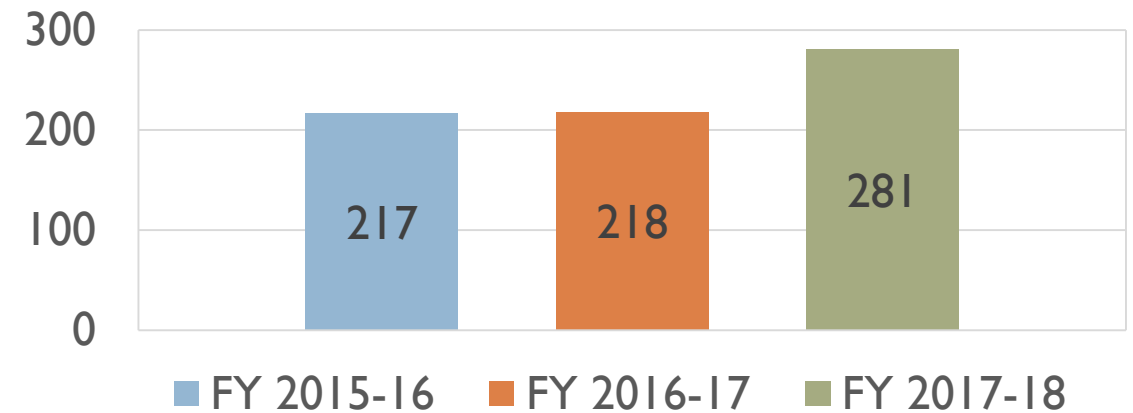

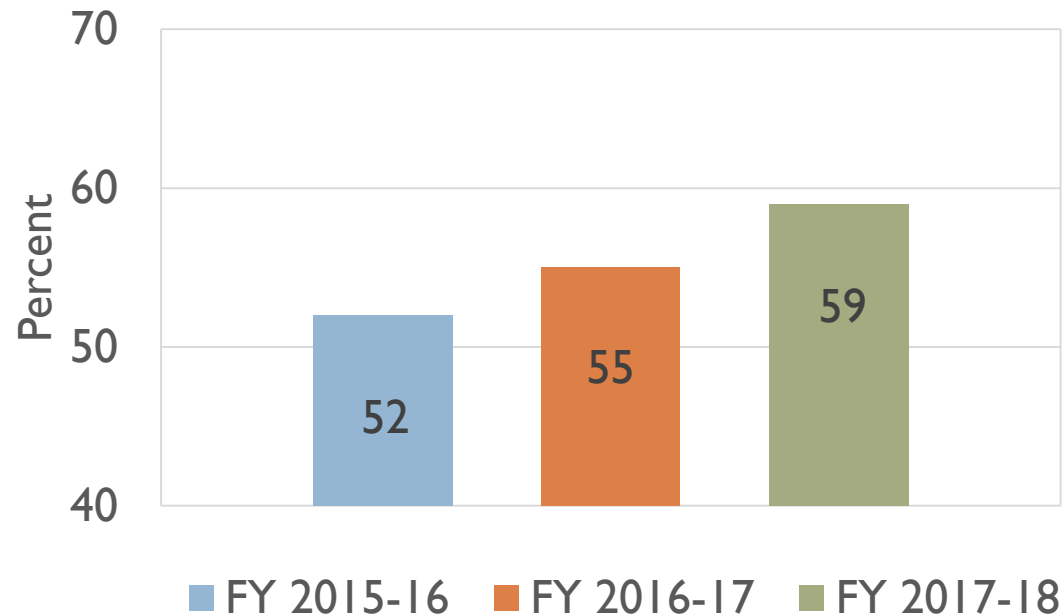
**Number of Positive Associations

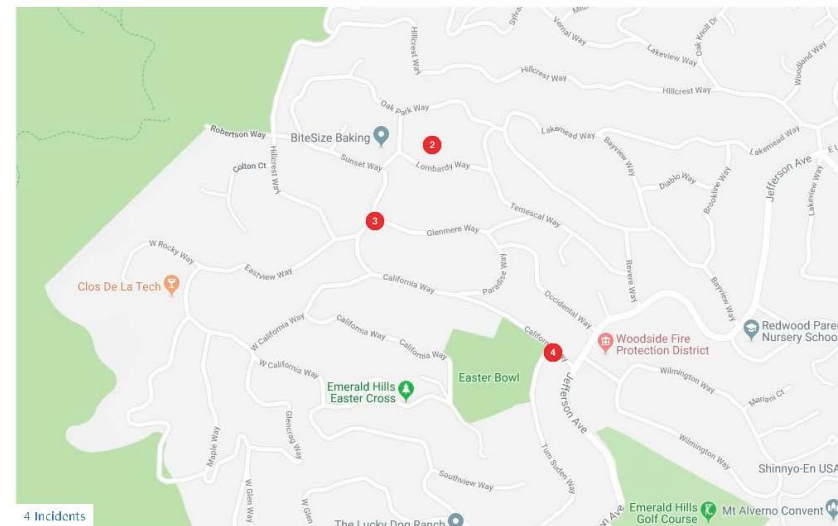

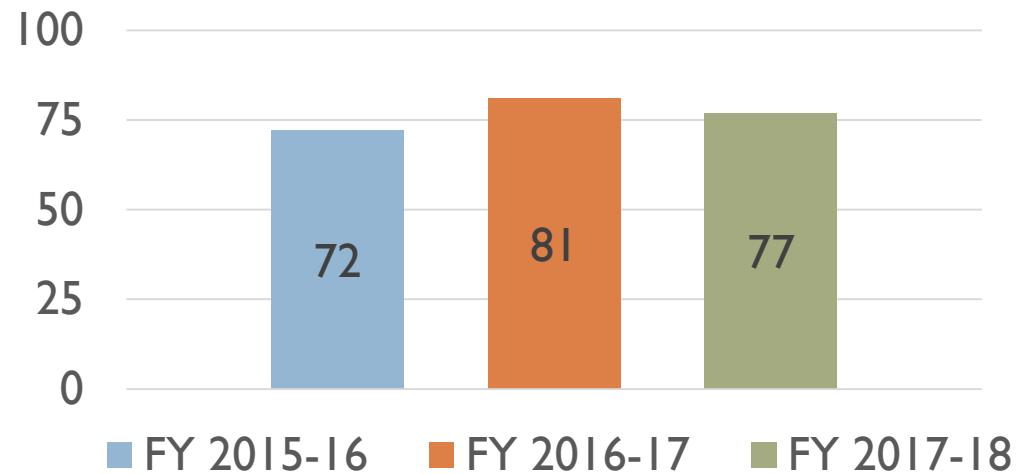

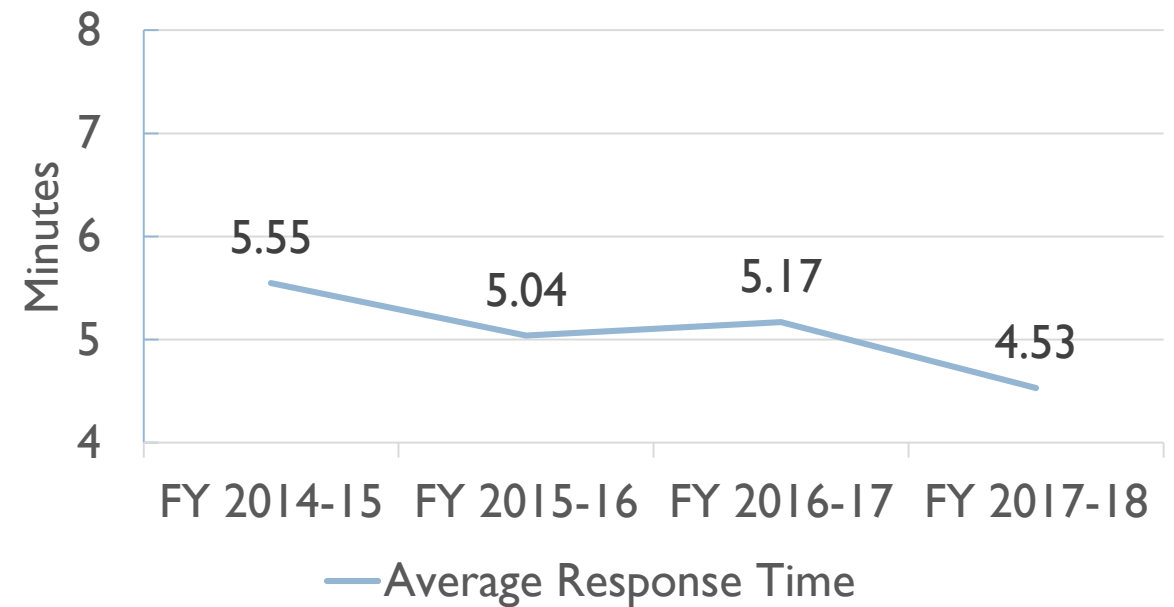

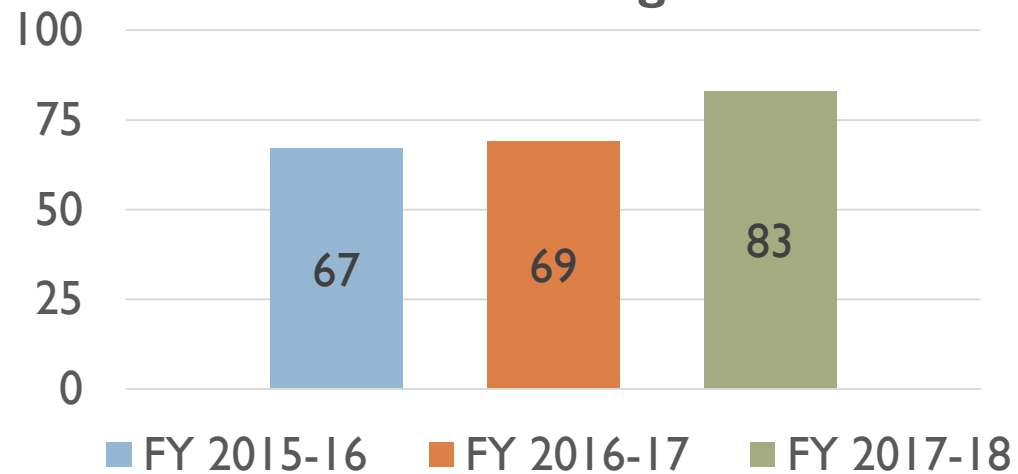
Average Response Time for Priority One Calls

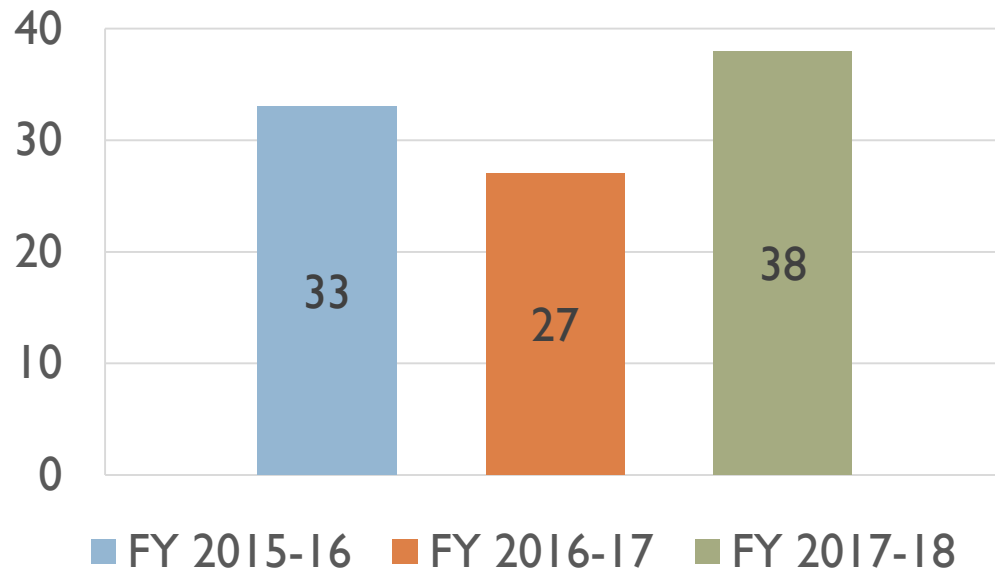
