THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING APRIL 2019 AS

## PARKINSON'S DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH

**WHEREAS**, Parkinson's Disease (PD) is a progressive neurological disorder of the brain that results from a loss of cells that produce dopamine; and

**WHEREAS**, Parkinson's Disease is characterized by motor symptoms and non-motor symptoms. Motor symptoms may include instability of posture or balance, gait difficulty, stiffness or rigidity of the arms, legs or neck, general slowness of movement and tremors; and

WHEREAS, Parkinson's Disease affects over 1.5 million people in the United States; and

**WHEREAS**, many people live with symptoms of Parkinson's Disease for several years before being diagnosed; and

**WHEREAS**, often people in the early stages of the illness assume that their symptoms are the result of normal aging or other health problems, such as arthritis; and

**WHEREAS**, People with Parkinson's Disease are at high risk of falling due to problems with balance, rigidity, and slowness of movement -- the primary motor symptoms of PD; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED** that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, hereby designates April 2019 as Parkinson's Disease Awareness Month and encourages all citizens to recognize and participate in this campaign to increase awareness and to support individuals living with Parkinson's Disease.
