RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A “NO OVERSIZED VEHICLE PARKING” ZONE ON THE EAST SIDE OF AIRPORT STREET IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREA OF HALF MOON BAY

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code section 22507 et al. and Section 7.28.070 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code allows the Board of Supervisors to establish parking restrictions that prohibit or restrict the stopping, parking, or standing of vehicles, including but not limited to, vehicles that are six feet or more in height, on certain streets or highways, or portions thereof, during all or certain hours of the day and associated signs and markings; and,

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has recommended that a “No Oversized Vehicle Parking” zone be established as noted herein; and,

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Works has been working closely with the Midcoast Community Council to address parking issues along Airport Street due to an increase in on-street parking of oversized commercial trailers, motor homes, and other large vehicles within the past several years and allow access for cyclists and pedestrians and reduce the dumping of human waste and trash in the nearby ditch; and

WHEREAS, property owners on adjacent blocks, extending a minimum of 300 feet from the proposed parking zone locations were notified of the date and time of this Board's meeting when these Items will be considered; and

WHEREAS, this Board has reviewed and concurs with the recommendation of the Director of Public Works.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that

A "No Oversized Vehicle Parking" zone be established at the following location:

- Airport Street (County Road No. 107) Half Moon Bay

Along the east side of Airport Street beginning at the intersection with Cornell Avenue and continuing northerly to the intersection with Cypress Avenue, for a distance of approximately 8,130 feet, more or less.
