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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AMENDMENT TO THE EXISTING AGREEMENT (NO. 30000-17-D034) WITH THE COUNTY OF LOS ANGELES DEPARTMENT OF MEDICAL EXAMINER-CORONER TO PROVIDE GUNSHOT RESIDUE TESTING SERVICES, EXTENDING THE TERM THROUGH SEPTEMBER 30, 2019, AND INCREASING THE AMOUNT BY \$25,000, TO AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$124,000

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, there has been presented to this Board for consideration and acceptance, an agreement, reference to which is hereby made for further particulars, whereby the County of Los Angeles Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner shall provide gunshot residue testing services for the Sheriff's Office Forensic Laboratory; and

WHEREAS, the County of Los Angeles Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner has been providing services to the Sheriff's Office Forensic Laboratory for more than five years; and

WHEREAS, the County of Los Angeles Department of Medical Examiner-Coroner charges the County a flat rate of \$675 per kit; and

WHEREAS, this service aids the Sheriff's Office Forensic Laboratory in the scientific investigation of crimes involving firearms; and

WHEREAS, both parties now wish to enter into an agreement to provide gunshot residue testing services for the Sheriff's Office Forensic Laboratory for the term

of October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2019, in an amount not to exceed \$124,000;
and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of such agreement and has examined and approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the same.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the President of the Board be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said agreement for and on behalf of the County of San Mateo, and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Sheriff or Sheriff's designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
