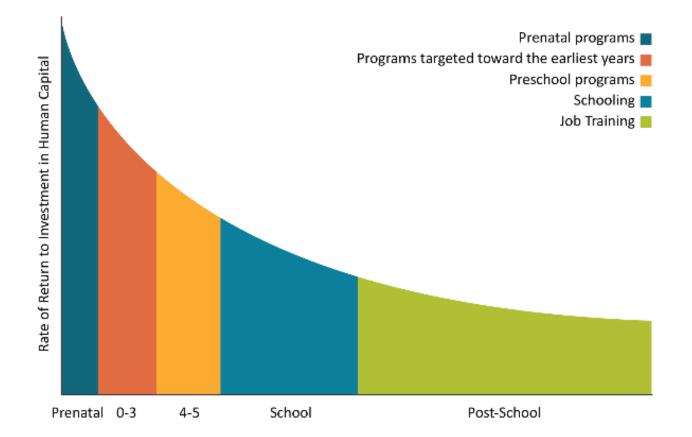

Department Summary

In Fiscal Year 2017-18, First 5 San Mateo County:

Invested **\$7,417,547** in our community:

- \$2,267,054 to support family functioning and authentic family engagement
- \$1,416,936 to support child health and development
- \$2,612,398 to support high quality early learning environments and access to early learning opportunities
- \$1,121,159 towards policy, advocacy, and improved systems of care

Served 9,878 unduplicated children, parents, and service providers:

- 4,118 parents and primary caregivers
- 3,167 children ages 0-5
- 2,593 direct service providers

Distributed **2,832** Kits for New Parents in six different languages

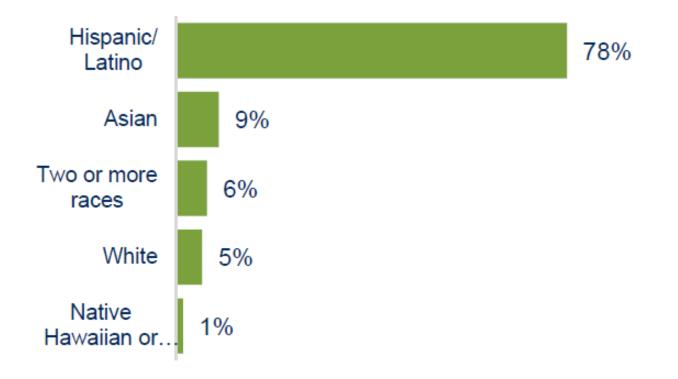






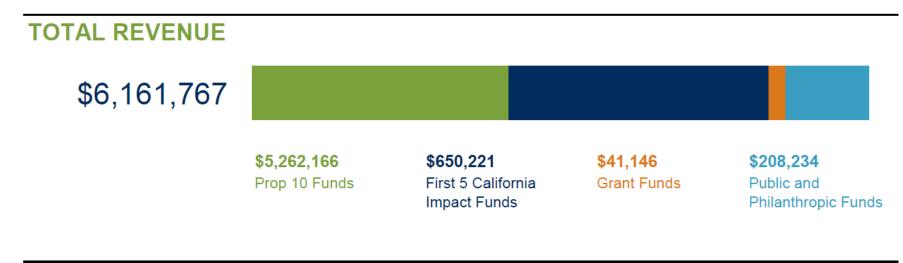


Top Ethnic Background Categories of Children*

FY 2019-21 Budget Overview

Significant Budget Changes

- Tobacco Tax Revenues are declining at a faster rate than previous year projections. A combined declining rate of 9% of Tobacco Tax Revenue over two-year period FY 2019-21.
- Ongoing efforts to acquire additional revenue opportunities through leverage funding from both F5CA and other entities.
- Approximate 39% Community Investment reduction in FY 2020 – 2021 per First 5's Long-Term Financial Plan.

Ground-Breakings - Arroyo Green & Stanford (~190 spaces)





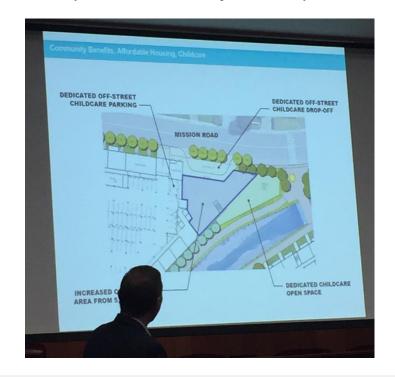
- South Main Street Mixed Use Greystar met with Build Up & hired design expert to plan for child care facility (71 spaces)
- Broadway Plaza received final approval from City Council (~100 spaces)
 - "Massive Redwood City housing, retail and office development up for final OK," May 19, The Mercury News



HIGHLIGHTS OF NEW DEVELOPMENTS: SOUTH SAN FRANCISCO

 South San Francisco PUC Site – after meeting with Build Up, added 2,800 SF to indoor space, increased outdoor space, and want to ensure infant care and subsidized care (~70-100 spaces)





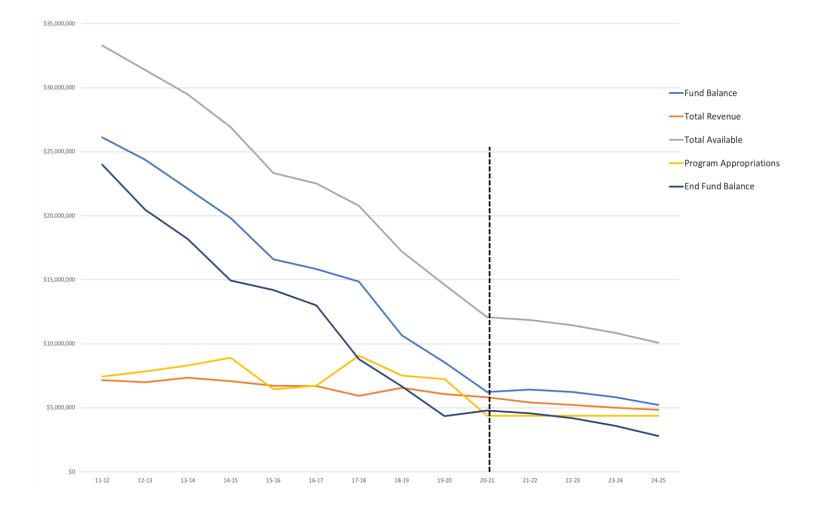
