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RESOLUTION: A) RE-CERTIFYING THE SEWER SYSTEM MANAGEMENT PLAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CALIFORNIA STATE WATER RESOURCES CONTROL BOARD STATEWIDE GENERAL WASTE DISCHARGE REQUIREMENTS FOR SANITARY SEWER SYSTEMS; AND B) DIRECTING THE DIRECTOR OF PUBLIC WORKS TO IMPLEMENT AND PERIODICALLY UPDATE THE REVISED SEWER SYSTEM MANAGEMENT PLAN AS NECESSARY TO COMPLY WITH CURRENT REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS AND BEST PRACTICES

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, as the Governing Board of the following County Sewer Maintenance and Sanitation Districts:

WHEREAS, the Districts own, operate, and maintain approximately 150 miles of sanitary sewer pipelines; and

WHEREAS, it is the Districts' responsibility to effectively manage the sewer systems to minimize sanitary sewer overflows (SSOs); and

WHEREAS, the State of California Water Resources Control Board has

adopted Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems Order No. 2006-0003 (Order) to provide a consistent, statewide regulatory approach to address SSOs; and

WHEREAS, Attachment A to the Order was promulgated and is known as Attachment A, SWRCB Order No. WQO 2013-0058-EXEC, amending the Monitoring and Reporting Program for Statewide General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems (together these documents constitute the "SSS WDR"); and

WHEREAS, the SSS WDR requires the preparation and approval of a Sewer System Management Plan (SSMP) by all public agencies that own or operate sanitary sewer systems greater than one mile in length that collect and/or convey wastewater to a publicly owned treatment facility; and

WHEREAS, the SSS WDR also requires these public agencies to self-audit their SSMPs at least every two years and re-certify the SSMP every five years, or whenever significant updates to the SSMP are made, by their governing board at a public meeting; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 070339, on August 25, 2009 approving the SSMP prepared in accordance with the Order and directing the Director of Public Works to implement and periodically update the SSMP as necessary to comply with current regulatory requirements and best practices; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Supervisors adopted Resolution No. 073304, on August 5, 2014 re-certifying the SSMP and directing the Director of Public Works to implement and periodically update the SSMP as necessary to comply with current

regulatory requirements and best practices; and

WHEREAS, the SSMP has been updated by staff in compliance with the requirements set forth by the SSS WDR; and

WHEREAS, the Board has been provided the opportunity to review the updated SSMP.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that:

- Acting as the Governing Board of the Districts, this Board does hereby find,
 determine and declare that the Sewer System Management Plan updated by staff in
 accordance with the California State Water Resources Control Board Statewide
 General Waste Discharge Requirements for Sanitary Sewer Systems and dated
 August 2, 2019 is approved and re-certified.
- The Director of Public Works is hereby directed to implement and periodically update
 the approved Sewer System Management Plan as necessary to comply with current
 regulatory requirements and best practices

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
