**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY MANAGER OR HIS DESIGNEE TO
ACCEPT \$3,136,875 IN EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE
GRANT (JAG) FUNDING THROUGH THE BOARD OF STATE AND COMMUNITY
CORRECTIONS FOR THE FUNDING CYCLE OF OCTOBER 1, 2019 THROUGH
SEPTEMBER 30, 2022**

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, on December 6, 2018, the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) released a Request for Proposals encouraging California counties to apply for funding under the auspices of the Edward Byrne Memorial Grant Program (JAG) to conduct local programs focused on the following areas: prevention and education programs, law enforcement programs, and prosecution, courts, defense, and indigent defense; and

WHEREAS, on April 25, 2019, the County Manager's Office (CMO) submitted a JAG program application requesting \$3,136,875 in funding for the Students With Amazing Goals (SWAG) program; and

WHEREAS, the County had previously received JAG funding for the SWAG program from 2016 through 2019; and

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2019 the CMO was notified by the BSCC that it had been selected to receive a second round of funding for the SWAG program for the

period from October 2019 through September 2022; and

WHEREAS, the County of San Mateo desires to participate in the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program administered by the Board of State and Community Corrections; and

WHEREAS, The County of San Mateo continues to support the provision of community-based diversion and educational multi-disciplinary services to at-risk youth in East Palo Alto and the Belle Haven neighborhood of Menlo Park, which continue to have the lowest high school graduation rates of all youth in San Mateo County.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors authorizes and directs the County Manager or his/her designee to accept the \$3,136,875 in Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant funding and sign the Grant Agreement with the BSCC, including any amendments thereof; and that the federal grant funds received hereunder shall not be used to supplant expenditures controlled by this body; and the County agrees to abide by the statutes and regulations governing the Federal Grants Program as well as the terms and conditions of the Grant Application as set forth by the BSCC.
