## RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A 20-FOOT ADA ACCESSIBLE PARKING ZONE ON HALSEY AVENUE IN UNINCORPORATED REDWOOD CITY

**RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, California Vehicle Code Sections 22507 et. al. and Section 7.44.010 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code allow the Board of Supervisors to establish parking zones that prohibit or restrict the stopping, parking, or standing of vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Public Works has recommended that a 20-foot ADA Accessible Parking Zone be established at 601 Stanford Avenue in Redwood City; and

WHEREAS, Department staff evaluated this request and determined that the recommended parking restriction will not adversely affect the community; and,

**WHEREAS**, this Board has reviewed and concurs with the recommendation of the Director of Public Works.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that:

- 1. An ADA Accessible Parking Zone is established at the address of 601 Stanford Avenue, Redwood City, on the northerly side of Halsey Avenue (County Road 649) commencing at approximately 25 feet north-west of the center line of Stanford Avenue and extending north-westerly on Halsey Avenue a distance of 20 feet, more or less.
- 2. The Department of Public Works is authorized and directed to post any

necessary signs and pavement markings.
