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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AN AGREEMENT WITH PACIFICA RESOURCE CENTER TO PROVIDE SERVICES INCREASING THE CAPACITY AND INFRASTRUCTURE FOR GROCERY RESCUE AND REDISTRIBUTION IN THEIR SERVICE AREA AS PART OF THE EDIBLE FOOD RECOVERY PROGRAM AS REQUIRED UNDER CA SB 1383, FOR THE TERM OF JANUARY 28, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2022, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$219,163

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, 30 to 40 percent of San Mateo County residents are food insecure

and have limited or uncertain ability to get healthy and nutritional food; and

WHEREAS, according to the State of California, short-term climate pollutants

from methane generated from food waste decomposition in landfills is a leading cause

of greenhouse gas emissions; and

WHEREAS, to both reduce hunger and greenhouse gas generation, the County

proposes to establish programs to support the creation of an Edible Food Recovery

Program as required under California SB 1383; and

WHEREAS, Pacifica Resource Center has partnered with Second Harvest of Silicon Valley to create a grocery rescue program; and

WHEREAS, the County aims to leverage as many partnerships and collaborations as possible with relevant organizations and cities in complying with CA

SB 1383; and

WHEREAS, the County wishes to enter into an Agreement with Pacifica Resource Center to provide services increasing the capacity and infrastructure for grocery rescue and redistribution in the northern region of San Mateo County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the President of the Board of Supervisors be and is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Agreement with Pacifica Resource Center and the Clerk of this Board shall attest the President's signature thereto.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Director of the Office of Sustainability, or the Director's designee, is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate) and/or modify the contract terms and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
