### RESOLUTION FURTHER EXTENDING PROCLAMATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY UNTIL THE COUNTY TAKES ACTION TO TERMINATE THE LOCAL EMERGENCY

**RESOLVED**, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

**WHEREAS**, Government Code Section 8630 and Chapter 2.46 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code authorize the Director of Emergency Services (“Director”) of the County of San Mateo (“County”) to proclaim a local emergency when the County is threatened by conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the County that are or are likely to be beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment and facilities of the County and require the combined forces of other political subdivisions to combat and the Board of Supervisors is not in session; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 3, 2020, the Director proclaimed a local emergency based on conditions of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within San Mateo County resulting from the COVID-19 coronavirus; and

**WHEREAS**, under Section 8630 of the Government Code, the local emergency set forth in the Director’s proclamation shall not remain in effect for more than seven days unless ratified by the Board of Supervisors; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 10, 2020, this Board adopted a resolution ratifying and extending the Director’s proclamation of local emergency and the resolution stated that

this Board would review, at least once every sixty days, the need for continuing the local emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 4, 2020, the Governor of the State of California proclaimed a State of Emergency related to COVID-19 throughout the State of California and, in so doing, the Governor waived the sixty-day time period in Section 8639 of the Government Code within which local government authorities must renew a local emergency and stated that any local emergency related to COVID-19 proclaimed by local government authorities would remain in effect until the local government authorities terminates its respective local emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors hereby finds that there continue to exist within the County conditions of disaster or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property that are beyond the control of the services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the County.

**NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED** that the local emergency proclaimed by the Director on March 3, 2020 and ratified and extended by this Board on March 10, 2020, is hereby further extended and shall remain in effect until the County takes appropriate action to terminate the local emergency.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Supervisors continues to delegate authority to the Director to terminate the local emergency, pursuant to Section 8630 of the Government Code, at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that any orders previously issued by the Director under the authority set forth in the Government Code or in Chapter 2.46 of the San Mateo County Ordinance Code shall remain in place and in effect until the same date.
