**ORDINANCE**

**AMENDING SECTION 7.28.070 “NO OVERSIZED VEHICLE PARKING” TO  
CHAPTER 7.28 “MISCELLANEOUS PARKING REGULATIONS” OF THE COUNTY  
OF SAN MATEO ORDINANCE CODE**

The Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California,

**ORDAINS** as follows:

**SECTION 1.** Section 7.28.070 No Oversize Vehicle Parking is amended in its entirety to

read as follows:

The Board of Supervisors shall, by Resolution, determine and declare those parking zones or parking spaces, upon the public highways over which the County has jurisdiction, which prohibit parking for oversized vehicles, which are for the purposes of this section vehicles over six feet in height, or any trailer, as the term “trailer” is defined in Vehicle Code Section 630, whether connected or unconnected, in order to prevent obstruction of vehicular and pedestrian traffic and to maintain the safe and efficient flow of vehicular and pedestrian traffic on the County's public highways.

The Director of Public Works shall cause to be marked by signs, markings, curbs, or other practical manner, the parking spaces where the parking of oversized vehicles is prohibited or where parking of any trailer is prohibited.

No person shall stop, park, or leave standing any oversized vehicle or trailer, whether attended or unattended, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in cases of emergency, or in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or else be subject to fines in accordance with the Chapter 1.08 penalty provisions of this Code.

This section shall not prohibit the parking of oversized vehicles or trailers on public streets for any of the following activities:

- a. Active loading or unloading of persons or property;
- b. Being used to provide public utility services to a property in the vicinity;
- c. Emergency repairs or waiting for a tow operator for no longer than eight hours; or
- d. Response to a public emergency by any emergency vehicle of any political subdivision of the State of California.
- e. Wheelchair-accessible vans.
