

### Phase II - Non-Profit Grants



- Opened May 6, 2020; Closed May 11, 2020
- Information Requested:
  - Purpose of Funding Request
  - Disruptions Due to Covid-19
  - Services to those most impacted by crisis
  - Financial Impact
- 213 Applications in 4 Categories:
  - Health
  - Human Services
  - Childcare
  - Arts/Cultural/Environmental/Other







- Initial review by County Staff and First 5
  - Completeness of application
  - Purpose for funding
  - Population served
  - Impact of services provided
  - Financial need
  - Also considered geographic representation.
- Final review by SVCF grants committee
  - All county recommendations supported



## **Selection Outcome**



- 52 Agencies Selected
  - 6 Childcare
  - 13 Health Services
  - 21 Human Services
  - 12 Arts/Cultural/Environmental/Other


- \$898,000 in Total Funding

# **Non-Profit Applicants/Selections**




#### **Non Profit Grants**
