

\$2M CHILD CARE RELIEF FUND

1.5% of CARES funds will support <u>at least</u>:



65 family child care homes with grants of up to \$10K
25 centers with grants of up to \$55K
26% of centers that provide subsidized care

Grants will support **1,500**+ of the county's most at-risk children by mid-Sept.


