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RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF AN AWARD FROM THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH FOR IMPLEMENTATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE CHILDHOOD LEAD POISONING PREVENTION PROGRAM FOR THE TERM OF JULY 1, 2020 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2023, IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1,020,075

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, the County has an interest in implementing and administering the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program to decrease the exposure of children to lead and the incidence of increased childhood blood lead levels, inform health care providers of their legal responsibilities with respect to blood lead testing requirements, and increase awareness of lead hazards among local governmental agencies and businesses; and

WHEREAS, both parties now wish to enter into an agreement, whereby the California Department of Public Health will provide funding to support the County's participation in the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program for the period of July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2023, for a total amount of \$1,020,075; and

WHEREAS, this Board has been presented with a form of the agreement and has examined and approved it as to both form and content and desires to enter into the amended agreement; and

WHEREAS, this Board wishes to expedite the execution of this agreement to ensure timely reimbursement for services provided.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Chief of San Mateo County Health or their designee is authorized to execute an agreement with the California Department of Public Health to provide funding for the County's Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief of San Mateo County Health or their designee is authorized to execute contract amendments which modify the County's maximum fiscal obligation by no more than \$25,000 (in aggregate), and/or modify the contract term and/or services so long as the modified term or services is/are within the current or revised fiscal provisions.

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
