Disposable Food Service Ware Ordinance

Purpose

- Adopted on 2/25/2020
- Reduce single-use plastic food ware
 - Pervasive pollutant with long-term harmful impacts

Key Elements

- Transition from plastic to natural fiber food ware (e.g., paper and sugarcane)
- Distribute accessories only when needed



Countywide Collaboration

- Developed model ordinance
- County's role in countywide collaboration
 - Lead education and enforcement efforts within cities that adopt
- City adoption
 - 6 cities: South San Francisco, Burlingame, Atherton,
 Half Moon Bay, Belmont, San Mateo



Proposed Ordinance Amendment

- Extend the operational and enforcement start date
 - Current date: March 25, 2021
 - Proposed new date: March 25, 2022
- Restaurants and other food facilities are experiencing unprecedented financial hardship as a result of COVID
