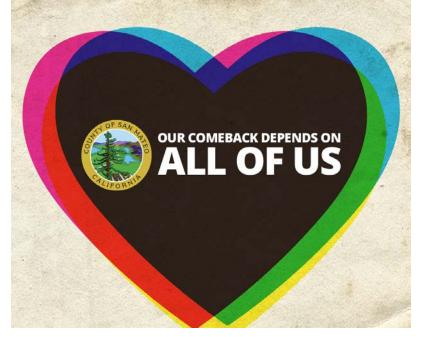

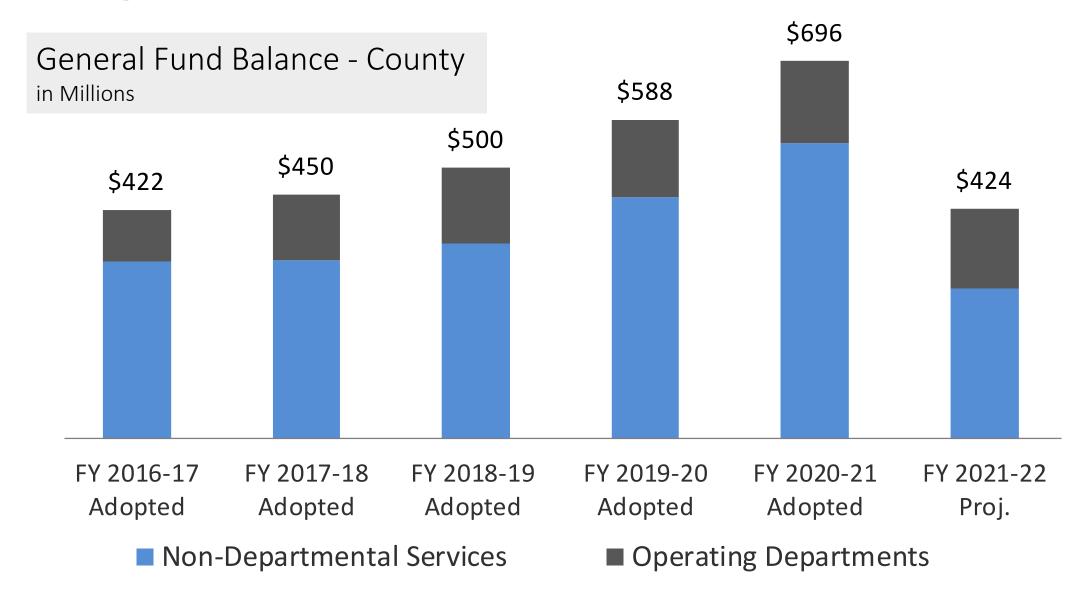

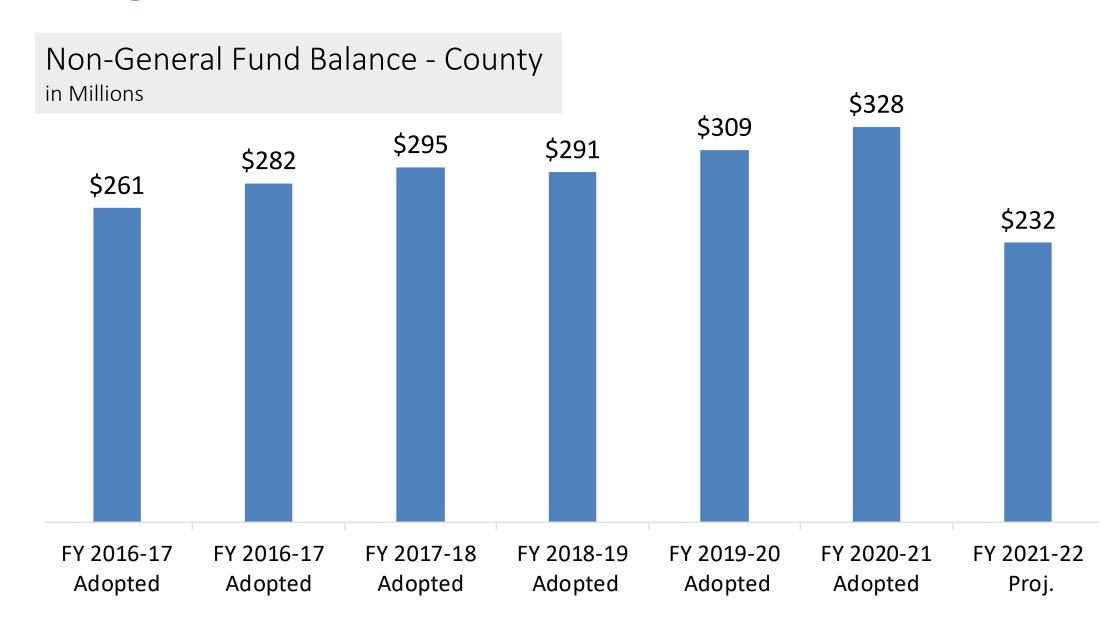

Jan 2021

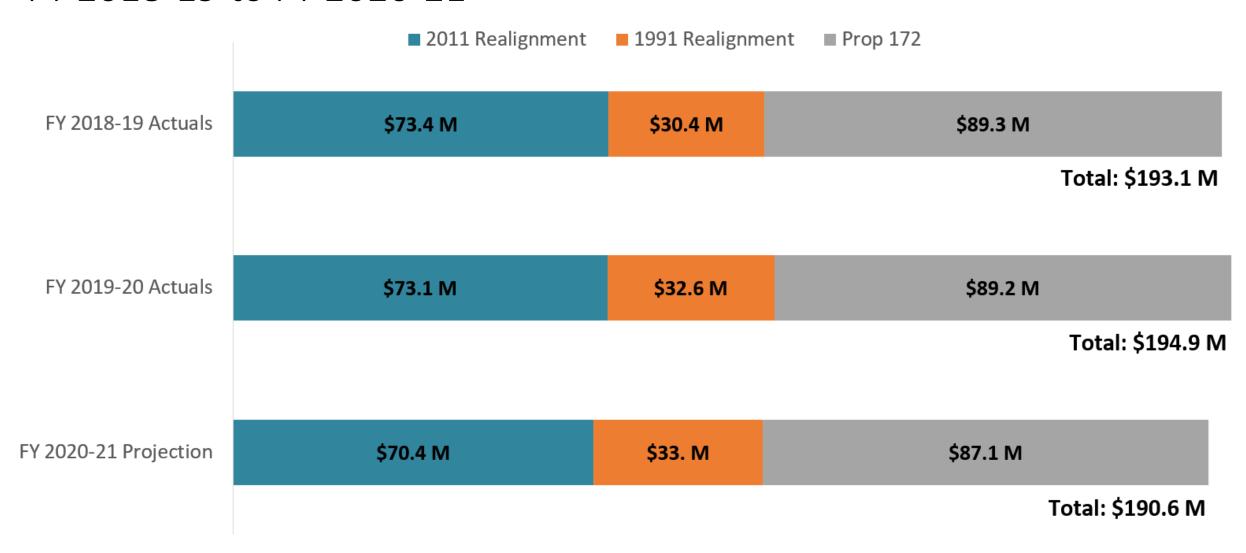
 Stay at home order rescinded, economic restriction remain

 Continued discussion of additional relief at the federal and state level

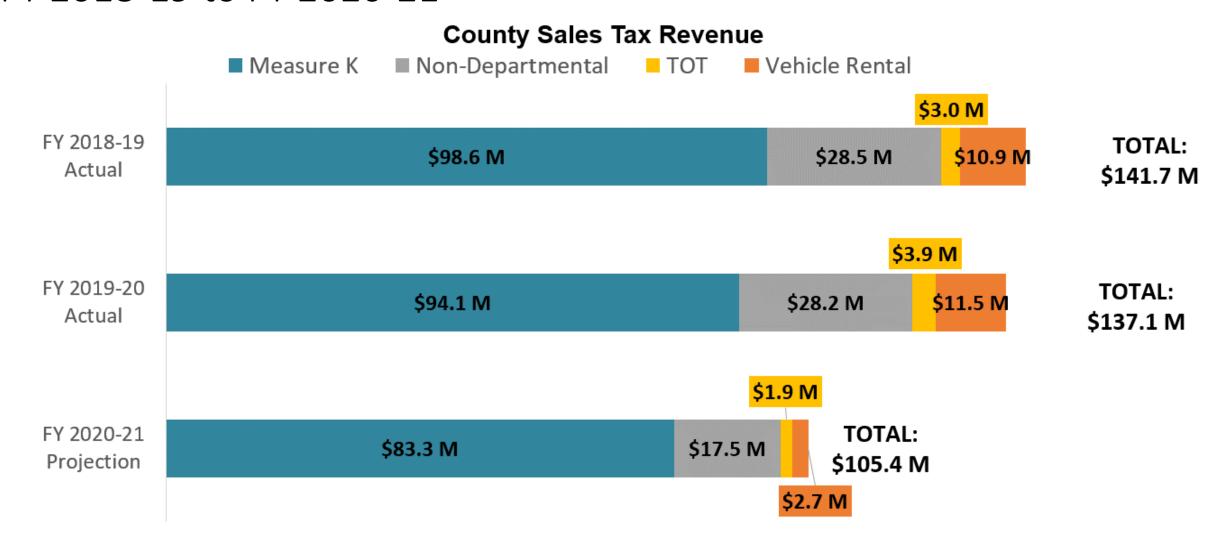
State Sales Tax Revenue
