The Memorandum of Agreement is for the period of the WPC pilot (initially 2017-2020, now extended through December 2021). This Agreement between San Mateo County Health (SMCH) and the Managed Care Plan, the Health Plan of San Mateo (HPSM) seeks to provide coordinated, efficient care as well as housing services to the most complex and vulnerable clients served by SMCH and insured by HPSM. It is in the interest of SMCH to partner with HPSM to ensure that the goals of the WPC pilot are met which include: 1) Fostering integration and collaboration between SMCH and the HPSM, 2) promoting efficient and coordinated care for the most vulnerable clients through among other strategies, data and information sharing 3) Increasing access to housing and supportive services. Ultimately some services provided for the period of the pilot will transition to a Medi-Cal benefit in January 2022 under CALAIM managed by HPSM which creates a need for collaboration and a smooth transition of our fragile clients.
