Fee Relief Program: Overview

- Target: businesses most severely impacted by COVID-19 Health Order restrictions
- Emphasis on small businesses
- Avoid manual process
- Minimize barriers to receiving the benefit
- Program-specific approach to maximize Fee Relief coverage
- 5,400 businesses to see relief
- 100% credit for certain annual fees





Retail Food

 Approx 3600 (80%) of businesses that sell food will have a fee credit

Targeted business categories include:

- obakeries & candy shops
- obreweries & wineries
- o restaurants & bars
- o convenience stores
- o most markets
 - Includes some large markets
- o cottage food businesses
- o mobile food trucks & carts
- o caterers

CUPA Commercial & Industrial Facilities

 Approx 1400 (42%) businesses regulated by CUPA will have fee relief (businesses that store or use hazardous materials onsite)

When and How?

Eligible businesses to receive credit on annual invoices generated 7/1/2021 - 6/1/2022

- One year of eligible fees will be credited
- Large "mom and pop markets: Submit Attestation Form to receive credit
