RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE EXTRA-HELP HIRING OF PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS' RETIRING SUPERVISING COMMUNICATIONS DISPATCHER, DAVID VOGT, PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE §7522.56(f)(1), AND FINDING THAT THE NATURE OF EMPLOYMENT AND APPOINTMENT IS NECESSARY TO FILL A CRITICALLY-NEEDED POSITION DURING THE 180-DAY POST-RETIREMENT SEPARATION PERIOD

RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, that

WHEREAS, David Vogt will retire August 7, 2021, after serving the County of San Mateo for more than 32 years, first as relief dispatcher while serving as a police officer for the cities of Half Moon Bay and San Mateo, then promoting to end his career as a Supervising Communications Dispatcher; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Vogt possesses credentials for Law, Fire, and Emergency Medical dispatching, as well as training and quality assurance skills, which are critical needs of the 9-1-1 Dispatch Center; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Vogt will be employed at the base rate of \$52.88 per hour, the current rate of pay for a Communications Dispatcher II-R (Extra Help) and would be limited to working a maximum of 960 hours each fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, Government Code §7522.56 requires a 180-day separation period as established by the California Public Employees' Pension Reform Act, before re-hiring

or contracting with a retired employee unless the entity's governing body makes a finding certifying that the appointment is necessary to fill a critically needed position.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY DETERMINED AND ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors certifies, pursuant to Government Code §7522.56(f)(1), the nature of the employment described above and that the requested appointment is necessary to fill a critically needed position in the Public Safety Communications Department before 180 days have passed given the facts outlined above, and accordingly approves the hiring of David Vogt, into an extra-help position upon his retirement.
