THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, STATE OF CALIFORNIA DESIGNATING NOVEMBER 19, 2021 AS

Transgender Day of Remembrance

WHEREAS, the Transgender Day of Remembrance in San Mateo County is observed on November 19th 2021 to honor the memory of those whose lives were lost as a result of anti-transgender violence and began in the State of California in 1998 after the murder of Rita Hester, a transgender woman and nationally is recognized on November 20th; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the Board of Supervisors of the County of San Mateo, State of California, hereby designates November 19, 2021 as Transgender Day of Remembrance in San Mateo County, and, in furtherance of that designation, hereby directs that the Transgender Flag be raised at County Center for the week of November 15th and invites all residents to participate in related activities and events.
