Parks Department Recommendation: Off-Leash Dog Access Program

Recommendation

A. Policy Guidelines for Off-Leash Dog Access Pilot Program


- (1) Off-leash dogs must be under voice and sight control:
 - a. Voice and sight control means the owner/handler must be in control of dog(s) at all times and must be able to recall and leash dog(s) at any time.
 - b. Owner/handler must have a leash for each dog under owner/handler control.
 - c. Dog must return immediately when called (maximum of 10-second return time).
- (2) Dogs must remain on designated and signed trails, within view and earshot, and no more than 25 feet away from owner/handler.
- (3) Dogs must be on-leash in developed areas (i.e. near traffic, parking lot, lawn or play field deck, picnic areas, etc.).
- (4) No more than two dogs off-leash per owner/handler.
- (5) Dogs are presumed to NOT be under control when they:
 - a. Threaten, harass, chase, or otherwise display aggression toward any person, animals or wildlife;
 - b. Display threatening behavior;
 - c. Physically harm people directly or indirectly by their actions;
 - d. Touch or jump on other park users who have not invited or engaged in interaction with the dog; or
 - e. Do not return when called (maximum of 10-second return time).
- (6) Owner/handler must have physical control of dog(s) when approaching or being approached by park users not also engaged in off-leash dog recreation.

B. Two Off-Leash Dog Access Pilot Locations: Quarry Park and Pillar Point Bluff

(1) Quarry Park: Off-Leash Dog Access Pilot Location #1

Proposal at Quarry Park (see map below)

- On-leash dogs are allowed on all trails
- Off-leash dogs are allowed on designated multi-use trails
- To protect children and sensitive species and habitat, dogs are not allowed in the playground or pond.



(2) Pillar Point Bluff: Off-Leash Pilot Location #2

Proposal at Pillar Point Bluff

- Sections of trails in Pillar Point Bluff are open to dogs off leash and under voice and sight control of their handler(s). See map:
 - o Jean Lauer Trail, post 3-15
 - o Ross' Cove Trail, post 5-14
 - o Between post 3 and 5
- To protect sensitive species and habitat, dogs are prohibited in all marsh areas, on all trails leading down to the beach, and on the entire beach.



C. Criteria for Evaluation of the Off-Leash Dog Access Pilot Program

There was consensus among the work group members to approve the following evaluation criteria for the off-leash dog access pilot program.
