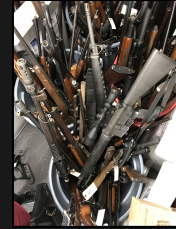


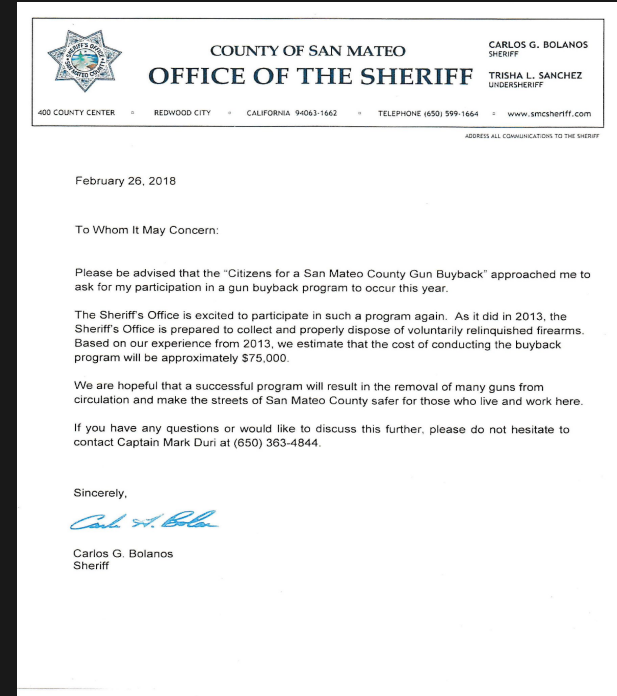
The San Mateo County Gun Buyback Program

Citizens for a San Mateo County Gun Buyback

- Met with Sheriff Carlos Bolanos Feb 2018
- Sheriff agreed to implement and advertise a buyback event
- We agreed to raise funds with goal of \$75,000



Our Approach

- Ask San Mateo County cities for a contribution
- Attended City Council meetings to present and answer questions
- Focused on the risk of suicide by firearm rather than mass shootings
- We raised \$140,000

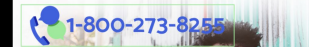
Purpose of Buybacks

- Further buyback research - 518 anonymous and voluntary surveys completed in 2018 & 19
- Increase number of gun free homes

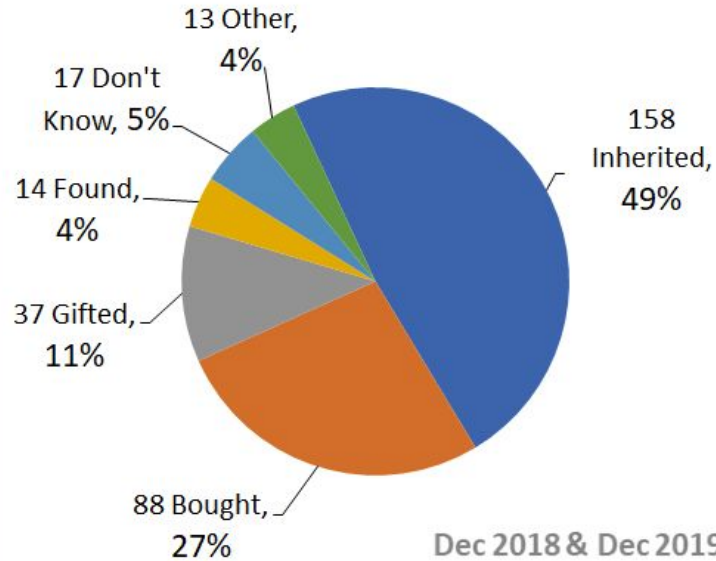

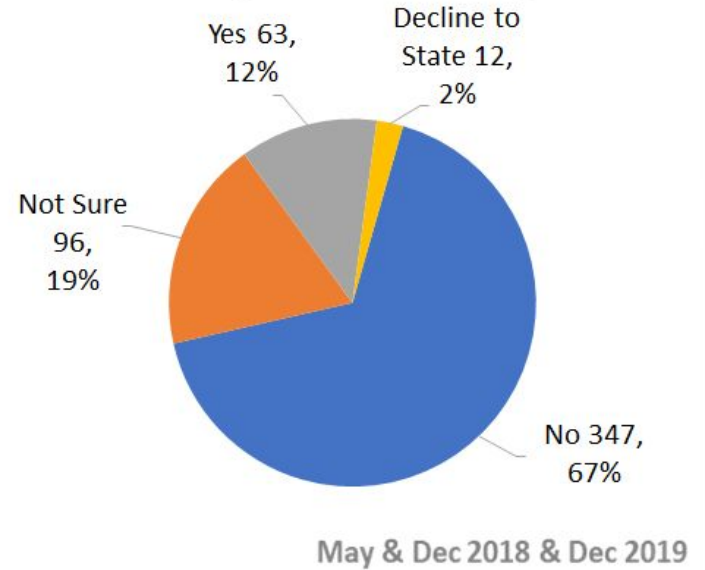

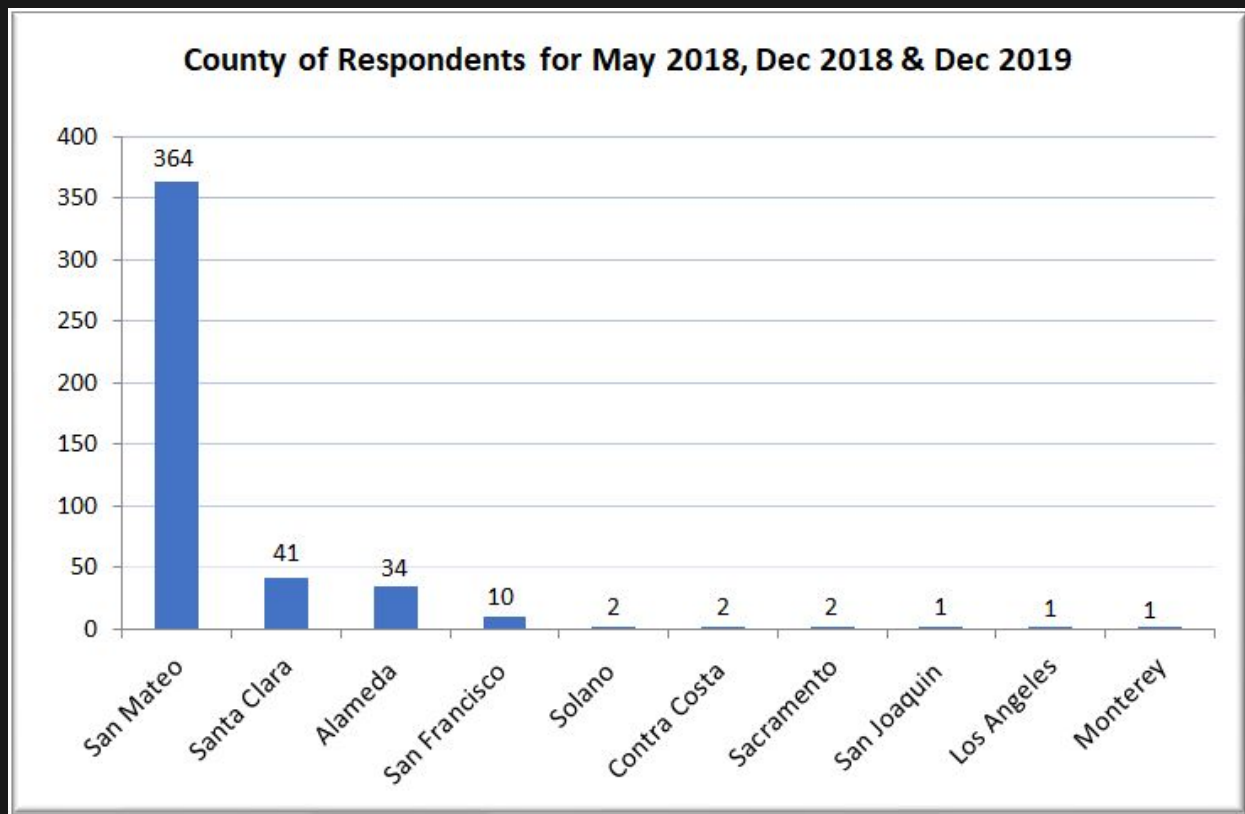
How Obtained Firearm?



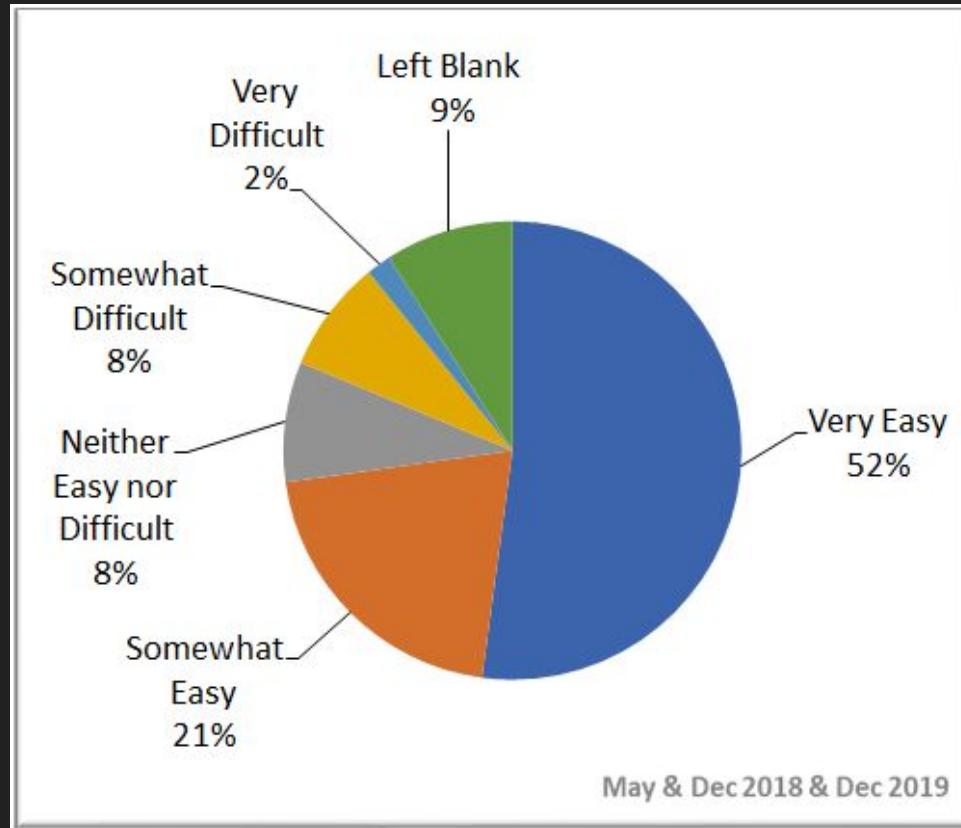
Plan to get another gun?
