Subject: Measure K: Agreement with Pivotal Connections to provide educational support to

current San Mateo County foster youth

RECOMMENDATION:

Measure K: Adopt a resolution authorizing an agreement with Pivotal Connections to provide educational support services to current San Mateo County foster youth for an amount not to exceed \$240,404 for the term of September 1, 2021 through August 31, 2022.

BACKGROUND:

The Children and Family Services (CFS) branch of the Human Services Agency (HSA) is committed to enhancing the well-being of children, adults, and families by providing professional, responsive, caring, and supportive services. In March 2013, CFS established a Foster Youth Education and Employment Services program to help foster children that are in primary and secondary education ensure their successful enrollment in and completion of post-secondary education.

This program is funded under **Measure K** and includes different services for current and former foster youth. Through the implementation and delivery of this program, CFS has identified a greater need for more focused educational services for foster youth and young adults.

An RFP was completed in January 2018 to seek specific employment services and educational supports for current and former foster youth/young adults to ensure their graduation from high school, college matriculation and graduation (or vocational training) and, ultimately, stable employment with earned income, one of the hallmarks of a successful transition into adulthood.

Pivotal was selected as the chosen vendor and was contracted to provide such services from September 1, 2018 through August 31, 2021.

DISCUSSION:

Pivotal currently provides academic planning, coaching, college preparation, and internship opportunities to foster youth from 9th - 12th grade. This agreement would provide another year of

services to current foster youth in grades 9 through 12 residing in San Mateo County and/or Santa Clara County as designated by San Mateo County staff.

County Counsel has reviewed and approved the agreement and resolution as to form.

The resolution contains the County's standard provisions allowing amendment of the County's fiscal obligations by a maximum of \$25,000 in aggregate.

PERFORMANCE MEASURE:

	FY 2021-22 Anticipated
At the completion of each school year, the percentage of current foster youth in grades 9-12 who received at least three quarters of educational case management services that will have earned sufficient school credits to advance and remain on-track for high school graduation.	
Based on a quarterly survey administered by the County, the percentage of children enrolled in or exiting the educational services program, or their parents/caretakers, that will report that they are satisfied (or better) with the services received from the provider.	90%

FISCAL IMPACT:

This agreement is 100% funded through **Measure K** Sales and Use tax. Appropriation of this funding is included in the FY 2021-22 Approved Recommended Budget and will be included in the FY 2022-23 Recommended Budget.
