RECOMMENDATION:

Recommendation for the reappointment term of Aurea Cruz to the Commission on Aging ending June 30, 2018.

BACKGROUND:

The mission of the San Mateo County Commission on Aging (CoA) is to improve the quality of life for seniors in San Mateo County through the promotion of independence, self-sufficiency, mental and physical health, as well as community involvement.

DISCUSSION:

Aurea Cruz has been a member since June 9, 2006 and is requesting reappointment for one year, completing her 12 year service on the commission. Aurea received a master's degree in public administration and certification as a nursing assistant. During her tenure on the Commission, Aurea has proudly served on a variety of committees and is the CoA liaison to the Commission on Disabilities. On September 12, 2017 a reappointment memo listed her term as ending in 2020. This memo reflects the correct expiration date of 2018 towards completion of her 12 years of service.
